

# Engineer's Report Village on Charming Lane Water System Improvements Henderson County, North Carolina



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Project No: 05016 November, 2005



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## I. Existing Water System

The City of Hendersonville owns and operates the existing water system which will serve the Village on Charming Lane. The City obtains its water from the Mills River where it undergoes treatment by a conventional water treatment plant.

The water lines extended to the project will be 4-inch and 2-inch PVC and will extend from an existing 6-inch line in Stepp Road.

The City of Hendersonville will assume ownership and operation of the new line upon satisfactory completion of construction. The City is the applicant for State approval.

## II. Project Service Area

The area to be served by the proposed water line extension is residential and lies east of the City off Stepp Road in Henderson County.

The development will consist of eight (8) residential lots. Assigning 400 gal/day/lot, a total average daily demand of 3,200 gal/day would be realized for this project.

This is well within the City's ability to supply, based on the capacity of the City's water plant and the current water production. The City of Hendersonville has officially agreed to supply water for this project.

## III. Water Supply Plan

The City of Hendersonville currently has on file with Division of Environmental Health, a Water Supply Plan which addresses additional potential service areas, along with projected future water demands and discussion of the source and quality of water supply.

Due to the capacity of the City's water system, the proposed Village on Charming Lane will not seriously impact the City's ability to continue to supply potable water to its customers.

## IV. Alternative Project Water Supply

The only other alternatives for providing water to the project area would be to drill individual wells, or to create a private community water system with wells. Due to the uncertainty regarding quantity and quality of ground water in the area, this alternative was not pursued.

Since water service was readily available from the City of Hendersonville existing distribution system, the Owner of the project has chosen to construct a water line extension.
