### **SUMMARY OF REQUEST:**

Pursuant to the Board of Commissioner's discussion on March 30th, the Animal Services Committee has changed the recommended Restraint/Confinement Section of the Animal Ordinance. The recommended Section now excludes the method by which an animal owner shall confine a domestic animal to their property. A summary of calls from the past 12 months will be presented by staff as well as a brief discussion on the Dangerous/Potentially Dangerous Dog Ordinance and newly established customer service initiatives.

### COUNTY MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend Board either adopt the Recommended Restraint/Confinement Section of the County Animal Ordinance or set a date for second public hearing.

### **RECOMMENDED DRAFT**

### SECTION 66A- Restraint / Confinement of Dogs and Cats Required

Definition- Domestic Animal- Any dog or cat which can be vaccinated against rabies with an approved rabies vaccine, and which has an established rabies quarantine observation period.

- A. This section is intended to reduce the number of stray animals that are allowed to run at large.
- B. No person owning or having charge, care, custody or control of any domestic animal shall cause, permit or allow the same to be or to run at large except while on the private property or premises of the person owning or having charge, care, custody or control of such domestic animal.
- C. When not on the owner's property, the domestic animal shall be under the control of a competent person and restrained by a leash, harness or other similar means of physical control.
- D. This ordinance pertains to all domestic animals with the following exceptions:
  - 1. Dogs used for control of livestock as long as said animal is in the process of controlling livestock.
  - 2. Dogs used or trained for hunting as long as said animal is in the process of being trained by a trainer and/or owner or on a legal hunt in the presence of the owner.
  - 3. Dogs or Cats while being exhibited or trained at a kennel club, or similar event, as long as said animal is in the process of participating in a kennel club, field trial or similar event.
  - 4. Dogs used for Law Enforcement while training and/or acting in the line of duty.

### **Proposed Restraint/Confinement Ordinance**

Based on the Board's discussion on March 30<sup>th</sup> and comments from the public, the Animal Services Committee and staff have developed a proposed Restraint/ Confinement Ordinance.

### Proposed Section 66A – Restraint/Confinement of Dogs and Cats Required

<u>Domestic Animal</u> (Definition): Any dog or cat which can be vaccinated against rabies with an approved rabies vaccine, and which has an established rabies quarantine period.

# Proposed Section 66A – Restraint/Confinement of Dogs and Cats Required (continued)

- A. This section is intended to reduce the number of stray animals that are allowed to run at large.
- B. No person owning or having charge, care, custody or control of any domestic animal shall cause, permit or allow the same to be or to run at large except while on the private property or premises of the person owning or having charge, care, custody or control of such domestic animal.


# Proposed Section 66A – Restraint/Confinement of Dogs and Cats Required (continued)

C. When not on the owner's property, the domestic animal shall be under the control of a competent person and restrained by a leash, harness or other similar means of physical control.

- D. This ordinance pertains to all domestic animals with the following exceptions:
  - Dogs used for control of livestock as long as said animal is in the process of controlling livestock.
  - Dogs used or trained for hunting as long as said animal is in the process of being trained by a trainer and/or owner or on a legal hunt in the presence of the owner.
  - Dogs or cats while being exhibited or trained at a kennel club, or similar event, as long as said animal is in the process of participating in a kennel club, field training or similar event.
  - Dogs used for law enforcement while training and/or acting in the line of duty.



## **Animal Service Calls - Aggressive**





# **Dangerous Dog Regulations**

#### DANGEROUS DOG REGULATIONS COMPARISON CHART HENDERSON COUNTY CODE VS. NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTE

1.	Definitions – Potentially	(c .1) Surgery	(2,a) Cosmetic Surgery
	Dangerous Dog	(c,3) apparent attitude	(2,c) vicious or terrorizing
2.	Definitions – Owner	Includes provisions for sheltering, feeding or caring for and persons under 18	Person or legal entity
3.	Definitions – Severe Injury	Lacerations	Disfiguring lacerations
4.	Control Measures / Enclosures	Securely enclosed, child resistant lock, concrete bottom and secure top	Securely enclosed and locked
5.	Control Measures	Leashed and muzzled when off property	Leashed and muzzled or otherwise restrained when off property
6.	Warning Sign	120 inches, visible from each exposure, include graphic representation for children	None
7.	Identification	Tattoo or microchip required	None
8.	Change of address or ownership	Notification required prior to transfer	Notification required

# **Civil Penalties for Violations of Dangerous Dog Regulations**

### Henderson County Code 66A-19

Keeping a dangerous/potentially dangerous dog:

\*unattended/loose/unrestrained - \$500 per day

\*without tattoo/microchip - \$500 per day

\*failing to notify of change of address or death - \$1,000 per day

\*failing to present proof of transferee responsibility - \$500 per day

[Possible additions: adequate enclosure; waning sign]

# **Rabies Regulations**

Part 6, Article 6 of NCGS Chapter 130A

- Requires the owner of every dog and cat over four months of age to have animal vaccinated against rabies.
- Provides that if a dog or cat is not wearing required vaccination tag and the ownership of the animal cannot be determined, the animal may be impounded.

### Rabies Regulations (cont.)

Part 6, Article 6 of NCGS Chapter 130A

- Duration of impoundment may not be less than 72 hours.
- During impoundment a reasonable effort must be made to locate animal's owner.
- Dogs or cats that are found not to have required rabies tags will be impounded if the owner is not located immediately.
