** ORDER **

Statement of Authority

Pursuant to its "Smoking Ordinance", adopted 7 September 1993, reiterated on , the undersigned was authorized by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners to designate smoking and non-smoking areas in buildings owned or operated by Henderson County. The Henderson County Board of Commissioners is authorized to regulate smoking in buildings owned or operated by Henderson County pursuant to Article 64 of Chapter 143 of the North Carolina General Statutes.

Findings

The United States Surgeon General released a report in June 2007¹ making certain findings relative to passive or "second-hand" cigarette smoking in buildings, including the following:

- 1. Secondhand smoke causes premature death and disease in children and in adults who do not smoke.
- 2. Children exposed to secondhand smoke are at an increased risk for sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), acute respiratory infections, ear problems, and more severe asthma. Smoking by parents causes respiratory symptoms and slows lung growth in their children.
- 3. Exposure of adults to secondhand smoke has immediate adverse effects on the cardiovascular system and causes coronary heart disease and lung cancer.
- 4. The scientific evidence indicates that there is no risk-free level of exposure to secondhand smoke.
- 5. Many millions of Americans, both children and adults, are still exposed to secondhand smoke in their homes and workplaces despite substantial progress in tobacco control.
- 6. Eliminating smoking in indoor spaces fully protects nonsmokers from exposure to secondhand smoke. Separating smokers from nonsmokers, cleaning the air, and ventilating buildings cannot eliminate exposures of nonsmokers to secondhand smoke. (Emphasis added.)

Henderson County should supply a safe working environment for its employees and citizens in buildings owned or operated by Henderson County.

Conclusion

Given the foregoing, it is physically impractical, and not feasible, to allow smoking within any building owned or operated by Henderson County.
