SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

During the Board of Commissioners meeting on August 2, 2010, direction was given to request proposals from Private Recycling companies to construct a MRF in Henderson County in partnership with Henderson County Solid Waste. The RFP was developed and issued on September 23, 2010, see attached. One response was received by the deadline on October 22, 2010 which was the attached proposal from American Recycling of SC, LLC (ARSC). ARSC is a reputable company that Henderson County Solid Waste (HCSW) has done business with for two years. HCSW has been sending recycling material to their MRF in South Carolina. In addition, their predecessor received material from HCSW for several years prior to that. The significant considerations from the proposal are listed on the attached presentation.

Separate from the RFP process discussed above, Curbside Management, Inc (CM) has submitted a contract proposal to receive our material at their existing location in Woodfin, NC. CM is also a reputable company that HCSW has done business with for several years. This alternative to the RFP process has strong benefits for HCSW and the considerations are listed on the attached presentation.

Henderson County Solid Waste (County) is soliciting proposals from qualified persons, firms or corporations (Vendor) to construct and operate a Singlestream Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) in Henderson County. This facility will process recycling material from Henderson County Solid Waste operations as a priority and if possible may accommodate out of County material. Henderson County is willing to partnership with a private organization in order to reduce processing costs of County material. Henderson County is open to various options that may assist a private organization with the construction and / or operation of a MRF located within Henderson County.

Detailed Scope of Services:

It is anticipated that the MRF will be located in available warehouse space within the County. Several potential locations have been identified by staff but other options will be considered. The Vendor will be responsible for all required permits and the facility will operate separate from the County's permit to operate with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources.

The County recyclable material will generally be delivered via roll-off trucks. The initial recyclable material is projected to be approximately 5,000 tons per year with 20% Blue bag Singlestream and 80% dual stream. It is anticipated that the County stream will quickly grow in excess of 10,000 tons with the growth coming from Singlestream material. Material from outside of the County will be permitted but have a secondary priority to Henderson County material.

Minimum Qualifications:

Qualified Vendors should have a minimum of four (4) years continuous experience in the installation and operation of Singlestream Materials Recovery Facilities with at least 10,000 tons of materials.

Submittal Requirements:

The Vendor will supply, as a part of their submittal, the following:

- Information relative to the Vendor submitting the statement of qualifications including but not limited to: Name of Vendor, primary contact, years in business, location of regional offices, and financial stability of Vendor.
- Information relating to the experience/history of the Vendor as it pertains to the design, layout, manufacture, installation and / or operation of MRF equipment up to and in excess of 10,000 ton of material per year.
- A detailed description of the sorting process that will effectively and efficiently meet the County's goals.
- A detailed description of the process and equipment's expandability.
- A detailed description of the operational experience, reliability of the technology and equipment the Vendor would utilize to meet the County goals.
- A detailed description of the partnership required from the County.
- List a minimum of three (3) references with contact person and contact information)
- Other actors/information that may have a material bearing on the County's ability to evaluate the Vendor's qualifications to install and operate a MRF.

Please see below for our RFP for Henderson County. We thank you for the opportunity to work closer with Henderson County on improving their recycling program. We have read through the RFP and understand the scope of the project and feel confident we can put together a proposal that will work for Henderson as well as the surrounding counties. Please see below for a detailed list of our qualifications as well as answers to all other inquiries:

SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS:

A. American Recycling's Statement of Qualifications:

American Recycling Group opened its first plant over 25 years ago. Our management team has over 100 combined years of experience designing, constructing, operating and growing successful Material Recovery Facilities. Below you will find a brief bio of pertinent information as it relates to this project for each of the members of our team:

Jack Lupas - Mr. Lupas is part owner and CFO of American Recycling. He has been in the recycling business for 28 years and has designed, built and operated 9 successful and profitable recycling plants in Atlanta, Birmingham, Nashville, Greenville, and Knoxville.

Ron Moore - Mr. Moore is part owner and president of American Recycling of SC. He has been in the recycling business for over 20 years. His experiences include fiber buyer for several 100% recycled fiber mills as well as running multiple recycling operations including the start up of the Greenville operation and the management of Charleston County's Material Recovery Facility. Mr. Moore was successful at growing the Greenville operation from start up to a strong player in the Upstate area. In 2008, American Recycling purchased FCR's Greenville MRF and managed to double the facility volumes within a year. The Greenville facility has continued to grow even in uncertain markets.

Sam Miller - Mr. Miller has over 20 years of experience in plant operations, equipment purchasing, and designing plant layouts. While at SP Recycling Corp from 2004 to 2006, Mr. Miller was the Director of Operations for 8 plants located in the southeast. SP Recycling Corp. built and operated (2) of the largest single stream plants in the US. Mr. Miller built and started up the Atlanta Plant in 2004, processed 2,000 tons per month and in 2005 increased over 8,000 tons per month. He built and started up the Portland Plant in 2002 with 0 tons, then 7 months later processed over 10,000 tons per month, which increased to 13,000 tons per month by the end of 2003. SP Recycling Corp. assumed responsibility of the LA Times which is the largest

over issue account in the world. SP was challenged with a 2 week notice that the current vendor was pulling out and Mr. Miller was able to provide extraordinary service to ensure that the transition was seamless.

At SP Newsprint Co. in Dublin Georgia from 1999 to 2000, Mr. Miller was the Recycling Plant Manager. Noted achievements were in increasing productivity, reducing labor cost and increasing fiber yield. Productivity was increased by 30% while reducing labor cost by 40% and increasing fiber yield by 3%.

B. Sorting Process and description of Expandability:

SORT PROCESS

The in-line sorting process would consist of and in-feed metering conveyor (in ground) to a glass breaker and screen where all glass would be removed from the process via conveyor. The remaining material would flow under a cross belt magnet where the steel cans would be removed. Remaining materials would be fed via conveyor to a 12 person hand sort line. The hand sort line would be above bunkers/containers and the material would be stored there until baled. The remaining items would flow over an Eddy Current where all aluminum would be removed and stored. The hand sort line would have a variable speed belt control by touch screen. This would allow for the belt to be adjusted to the material being sorted. This sort line could produce 8 to 10 tons per hour of sorted materials. The sorted material would be moved to a two ram baler for baling and shipping. The higher quality sort by this method would produce higher prices to the mills.

MAJOR EQUIPMENT LIST: See Table A

Davco custom builds all steel components to meet the high demands of every day use. The MRF is pre-assembled in our facility prior to shipping. Nord gears and drives are used with variable speed inverters which are tied directly to the start up control panel. The touch screen will start the entire system. The screen is accessed by password.

EXPANDABILITY

The system is modular in design and many components of the sorting process can be added with very little down time. Items that can be added include an occ screen, news screen, or other components as needed. All systems are designed with Phase II, Phase III expansion capability with minimal alteration built in. Most upgrades will re-use all existing equipment.

C. Operational Experience of our Vending Partner- Davco Steel:

Davco Steel, Inc. Is a corporation legally registered and in good standing in the State of Georgia and The State of South Carolina, U.S.A. We have been operating in the recycling industry as a premier installer of modern recycling systems since 1999. Our manufacturing facility is in Loris, SC. which has more than 100,000 sq feet of space.

D. Description of County-Vender Partnership:

We at American Recycling want to thank you again for allowing us to submit this RFP. We feel that our experience and qualifications in managing MRFs and marketing materials along with our vender partner Davco's experience in building and installing high quality material sorting systems will compare highly with any other company out there.

While we are very well qualified to design and build a great system for the county, we feel our clear strength is in running plants. We have a proven record of taking new or underutilized and inefficient facilities and both growing the volumes and maximizing efficiencies. We feel this point alone will ensure a competitive market for Henderson county as well as the other surrounding communities to deliver their recyclable materials for years to come.

- American Recycling is estimating the start up cost to be between \$1,000,000 and \$1,200,000. We would ask Henderson County to finance \$550,000 towards the start up costs at an interest rate of 4.5%. The loan will be amortized over a 10 year term in conjunction with this agreement. We will offer three 5 year extensions that will be at Henderson County's sole discretion.
- American Recycling will seek to sign a 10 year lease for the warehouse located at 4600 Hendersonville Hwy. in Fletcher NC.
- We will contract, manage and pay for all needed sight preparation work to include grading, installation of a scale, paving, fencing and installation of new drive in doors.
- We will acquire all permitting and licenses as required by state and local regulations.
- We will arrange for all utilities to be in place for an agreed upon start date.

- We will design a system as described above that will handle all of the county's volumes into the foreseeable future. We will build and install the complete system capable of running both Dual Stream Recyclables and Single Stream Recyclables.
- We will purchase all other miscellaneous equipment (rolling stock, tools, office equipment...) needed for the operation of the MRF.
- We will hire and train all needed personnel.
- We will create a safety program that will ensure a clean and safe facility.
- We will create and implement world class efficiency procedures.
- Each month American Recycling shall calculate the Average Market Value ("AMV") of the Residential Program Recyclables defined as the sum of commodity prices (U.S. Dollars per Ton) posted on the first day of the month in SecondaryMaterialsPricing.com and SecondaryFiberPricing.com multiplied by the composition of Recyclable Materials (See Table 2). We will offer Henderson County guaranteed floor pricing as follows for the grades listed:
 - 1. Dual Stream

\$10.00 per ton

- 2. Single Stream w/out Bags \$ 0.00 per ton
- 3. Single Stream with bags -\$10.00 per ton

This Pricing is higher than what we currently pay you for Dual Stream Recyclable delivered to our Greenville facility. Between freight savings and the new price structure, the county should see a payback on it's investment in less than 5 years.

- American Recycling will guarantee Henderson County priority service over any and all other suppliers.
- American Recycling will also guarantee premium pricing over all other municipalities.
- American Recycling will work with Henderson County to create a community education and outreach program. We will establish an education room, provide tours for small groups and classes and hand out literature on recycling.

and delivery of the recyclables to Curbside Management's MRF located at 116 N. Woodfin Ave, Asheville, NC 28804.

3 to 4 Year Contract: Henderson County would pay \$00/ton, Curbside Management responsible for transportation

Henderson County would pay \$00/ton to Curbside Management for the processing of recyclable material. Curbside Management would be responsible for the transportation of recyclable material from the Henderson County Transfer Station.

5 Year + Contract: Henderson County would pay \$00/ton, Curbside Management responsible for transportation, plus revenue sharing

Henderson County would pay \$00/ton to Curbside Management for the processing of recyclable material. Curbside Management would be responsible for the transportation of recyclable material from the Henderson County Transfer Station. In addition, Curbside Management would share the revenue generated by the Henderson County recyclable material with Hendersonville County. For example, using December 2010 market value, if Curbside Management received 10,000 tons annually of recyclable material consisting of a normal curbside mix, Henderson County could potentially receive \$8,880 monthly or \$532,782 over the life of a 5 year contract.



Pricing Proposal #2

Curbside Management is also prepared to enter into discussions for a Material Recovery Facility to be located in Henderson County. This new Material Recovery Facility could provide new in-county jobs as early as February 2011. We have identified five potential sites to locate this facility in Henderson County. Due to our recent MRF expansion, Curbside Management is current with the new technologies and we have established vendor relations and contacts. Our proximity enables us to proceed in an expedited manner to meet the goals and timelines required by Henderson County.

The policy established by the State in the Solid Waste Management Act under GS 130A-309 is that contracts with the private sector should provide for recycling and solid waste management services "in the most cost-effective manner". We believe either Proposal #1 or #2 will allow Henderson County to manage its recyclables in the most cost effective manner. We will be contacting you Tuesday 12/28/10 for further discussions.
