SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

The Recreation Advisory Board (RAB) reviewed its bylaws and unanimously recommends several changes outlined in the attached draft bylaws. All changes are highlighted with additions being <u>underlined</u> and deletions being <u>struck through</u>.

Most of the amendments presented were redrafted so the bylaws reflect current procedural practices. Substantive changes suggested in the bylaws include:

- Clarifying the Function of RAB(Article II Section A);
- Adding a non-voting member to the Board who will be an individual from the Henderson County Schools (Article III, Section A);
- Deletion of all standing committees because they were not being used. Temporary committees may be created as needed (Article VII, deletion of Section C);
- Addition of an attendance policy for members so that those missing more than 25% of meetings in a calendar year shall be reviewed by RAB and possibly reported to the Board of Commissioners (Article X).

These changes were unanimously recommended by the Recreation Advisory Board at its February meeting. The bylaws will not take effect until approved by the Board of Commissioners.

County staff will present further information on this matter and will be available to address any questions or concerns this Board may have.

BYLAWS FOR THE HENDERSON COUNTY PARKS & RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD

Article I: Name

The name of this committee shall be called the Henderson County Parks & Recreation Advisory Board, hereinafter referred to as the "Recreation Board". The Recreation Board is formed by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners pursuant to the authority of North Carolina General Statutes 153A-76 and 160A Article 18.

Article II: Function

- A. The Recreation Board shall serve in an advisory capacity only. The Recreation Board shall provide recommendations to the Board of Commissioners, advocate for recreational services in Henderson County, and advisee to the Parks and Recreation Director regarding long-term planning and policies concerning the programs, capital projects, future development and exter olicies of the Parks and Recreation Department as appropriate. The Recreation Board shall also ear appeals of Parks matters as needed.
- B. The Recreation Board shall have no supervisory authority over the Parks and Recreation Director or department personnel. The Director shall report to the County Manager 's Office and shall supervise the operation and administration of the Parks and Recreation Department.

Article III: Membership

A. The Henderson County Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall consist of nine (9) voting members, and in addition may include a tenth non-voting, ex-officio member who is also a Henderson County Commissioner. All members shall serve three 3 year terms. Members shall be appointed by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and may be re-appointed upon expiration of terms. Terms shall expire the first day of March. The Recreation Advisory Board may also have a non-voting membe from the Henderson County schools to advise and inform the Board's recommendations from the ducation perspective

B. Compliance with Recreation Ordinance. All members must comply with the Henderson County Recreation Ordinance, and local, state and federal law as the parks system and recreation. Failure to omply with this provision may result in the immediate dismissal from the Board.

Article IV: Officers

- A. The Recreation Board shall elect its own officers, by a majority vote of the voting members. Officers shall serve a term of one year, to correspond to the County's fiscal year of July 1 -June 30. Two officers shall be elected, a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.
- B. The election of officers, Chairman and Vice-Chairman, shall take place by the following procedure:
 - 1. The chairman shall appoint a Policy Committee, consisting of 4 members, which shall have the responsibility of nominating officers at the May meeting of the Recreation Board.
- 2. Election of officers shall take place at the June meeting.
- C. The new officers shall take office on July 1 each year, which is the beginning of the county fiscal year.
- D. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preside at all meetings.

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- E. The Vice-Chairman shall perform duties of the Chairman in the absence of the Chairman.
- F. In the absence of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman from a meeting, the longest tenured advisory board member shall serve as Chairman of that meeting.

Article V: Organization

- A. The Administrative Secretary of the Parks and Recreation Department shall serve as the Clerk of the Recreation Board. It shall be the duty of the \underline{C} elerk to notify members of all meetings, to keep full and accurate minutes of all meetings, to capture the votes on the Board's recommendations, and to have a copy of the agenda and minutes of each meeting sent to each member, to the County Manager's Office and the Clerk of the Board for the Henderson County Commissioners. The meeting minutes shall be signed by the Clerk of the Recreation Board-and hairman
- B. The Director and division supervisors shall submit will provide program reports concerning the Recreation Departments programs, events, Park updates, and department at the regular meetings of the Recreation Board each month as appropriate. Budget update reports will be provided as requested by the members. These reports may be in a written or spoken form. A copy of these reports or a copy of the minutes describing the reports shall be sent available to each member, the Henderson County Manager 's Office and the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners by the Clerk to the Recreation Board upon request. Annual reports concerning the Parks and Recreation Department, such as financial information, may be required by the County Manager <u>'s Office</u> and copies shall be provided to the "Recreation Board". <u>Reports, minutes, and</u> ecommendations of the Recreational Advisory Board shall be available to the public under North Carolina Public Records Law.

Article VI: Meetings

A. Regular meetings of the Recreation Board shall be held $\frac{1}{1000} \frac{1}{1000} \frac{1}{1$ month and shall be held in the office of the Recreation Department or at some other designated place. A list of the monthly meeting dates each year shall be sent to the Clerk of the Henderson County Board of Commissioners at the beginning of each year, as per the North Carolina Open Meetings Law.

Presiding Officer. The presiding officer of each meeting of the Committee shall be the chair of he Committee. In situations where the chair is unavailable or unable to participate in the meeting or any particular matter before the Committee, the vice-chair shall preside. In the event that neither the chair nor the vice-chair is available, the members of the Committee, by affirmative ote of the majority, may appoint an acting chair who shall have all powers of the chair whil acting as presiding officer.

- <u>B.</u>C. The order of business at regular meetings shall be as follows:
 - 1. Call to order by Chairman
 - 2. Approval of Minutes
 - Public Input- <u>public testimony not related to guasi-judicial hearings shall be limited to 3</u> minutes unless approved by the Chair.
 - -Information Items
 - 5.4. New Business
 - 6.5. Unfinished Business
 - iscellaneous Update from the Recreation Director

8.6. Adjournment

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- C.D. Special meetings may be called by the Chairman, or upon written request from a majority of the body. Written notice of such meetings shall be mailed to each Recreation Board members home address at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting. In addition, written notice of such special called meetings shall be posted on the Recreation Department Bulletin Board_website, sent to the Clerk to the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and mailed or delivered to the media, and sent to those who have requested such notice. The notice of the special meeting shall state the purpose of said special meeting. Only those items stated in the notice can be considered at the special meeting.
- D.<u>E.</u> The meetings of the Recreation Board and all standing and special committees shall be conducted in accordance with the North Carolina Open Meetings Law.

Article VII: Committees

- A. Standing committees shall be appointed by the Chairman at the regular July meeting of each year as needed. Vacancies on the committees may be filled by the Chairman at any regular meeting.
- B. Committee meetings may be called at the request of the Chairman.
- C. Standing Committees of the "Recreation Board" are as follows:
 - 1. Policy 4 members

It shall be the duty of the Policy Committee to make recommendations concerning the Capital Improvement plan (CIP) budget, program and project budgets for the ensuing fiscal year. The Henderson County Budget Calendar shall dictate the time line for preparation of the annual parks and recreation department budget. The policy committee shall meet to provide input on the departments program and project budgets, prior to consideration by the Recreation Board. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to assist the Director and Chairman of the Recreation Board, in explaining final drafts of these budgets and C.I.P. plan to the Recreation Board. Other responsibilities of this committee may include giving advice on external policies concerning the Parks and Recreation Department and nomination of officers for the Recreation Board.

2. Park Planning and Development 4 members.

This committee will study the need, use, demand, and availability of areas and facilities (including water areas) and make recommendations on acquisition, development, expansion use and operation of all areas and facilities owned, used and leased or proposed to be acquired by the Parks and Recreation Department.

3. Program – 4 members

This committee shall serve to give advice on the recreation programs, activities, special events, sports, athletics, outdoor recreation events, festivals, and maintenance programs for the parks and recreation department and give information about the same to the full "Recreation Board",

 \mathbb{D} . Special committees and park advisory sub-committees may be appointed by the Chairman for such purposes as may be deemed necessary.

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E.D. The Chairman and Director shall be ex-officio members of all committees and subcommittees and as such, notified of all committee meetings.

Article VIII: Procedures

- A. A majority of the voting members present at an official meeting shall constitute a quorum. <u>Once</u> <u>quorum is established at a meeting it cannot be lost for the remainder of the meeting. Quasi-</u><u>Judicial proceedings must have the necessary number of members present for the entire hearing.</u> For a motion to pass, approval must be given by a simple majority of the members present.
- B. Roberts Rules of Order- (revised edition) shall constitute the parliamentary authority for the procedures at all meetings.
- C. QUASI-JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS. Such proceedings shall be ruled by North Carolina General Statute, case law, and the Henderson County Code and the Rules established by the Board of Commissioners.
 - 1. <u>m</u>. The Recreation Advisory Board has the authority to hear appeals of staff decisions based on Parks and Recreation Department policies and procedures. Matters concerning such issues may only be determined by the Board after conducting a quasi-judicial proceeding.
 - 2. <u>Formation of Appellate Committee</u>. The Recreation Advisory Board shall form a subgroup of 3 to 5 members to serve on the Appellate Committee. Members of the Appellate Committee shall be chosen at the same time as Officer elections.
 - 3. <u>Purposes and Objectives</u>. The purpose of these procedures is to provide an orderly method by which the Committee can hear and decide all quasi-judicial proceedings. The Board's objectives when conducting such proceedings are (1) to conduct all proceedings in a fair and efficient manner, (2) to base all decisions on competent and relevant evidence, (3) to ensure that the applicable policy and procedures are being enforced and administered in a fair and efficient manner, and, (4) to provide the citizens of Henderson County an administrative avenue to contest and appeal decisions made pursuant to the Parks and Recreation Department policies and procedures which adversely affected them.
 - 4. <u>Notice</u>. Notice shall be provided to the appellant and shall be advertised in the regular meeting notice or special meeting notice.
 - <u>Rules of Procedure</u>. Each quasi-judicial proceeding must be conducted in substantial conformity with the Henderson County Board of Commissioners procedures for quasijudicial proceeding.
 - 6. <u>Decisions</u>. Decisions shall be rendered by the Committee by a majority of the members present required to pass a motion.
 - 7. Written Findings. Appeal decisions shall be in writing.
 - 8. <u>Minutes and Maintenance of Records</u>. The minutes for quasi-judicial proceedings shall be taken in detail with detailed summaries of all evidence or testimony presented and statements made by members of the Board. The minutes may be verbatim transcripts of the hearing.

Article IX: Voting

 A. Tie Vote

 Tie Vote Tie votes at meetings shall be broken by the vote of the Chairman or acting Chairman.

 B. Absentions- Should a member fail to vote on any matter before the Committee, without having been excused from such vote, such abstention will count as an affirmative vote.

 C. Duty to Vote. It is the duty of each member, including the chair, to vote unless otherwise excused. The Committee may excuse members from voting on any matter involving their own

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Article X: Attendance

<u>All members of the Committee are expected to attend the regular and/or special meetings of the</u> <u>Committee.</u> Any member not able to attend must notify the secretary in advance of the meeting. Any member having missing 25% of meetings in a calendar year running July to June will be reviewed by the <u>Committee and may be reported to the Board of Commissioners to be replaced</u>. The absence of any member from three consecutive regular meetings, except when such absence is made

ne assence of any memory non-area consecutive regular meetings, energy when such assence is made necessary by sickness or other similar causes ruled by the Chairman as emergency in nature, will declare vacant the seat of such member, in which event the vacancy thus created shall be filled by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners, after receipt of written notification of such vacancy from the Recreation Board Chairman.

Article XI: Amendments

All amendments to these pules bylaws shall be proposed in writing and discussed at the next meeting of the Recreation Board must be proposed in writing in one Recreation Board meeting and are acted upon a the next regular meeting, then submitted to the Henderson County Board of Commissioners for final approval.
