RE: Henderson County Facility Projects Status Report

This report is a review of the scope and statuses of assigned construction projects and includes specific updates in regard to county funded construction activities. This report is a continuation of county construction activity statuses.

Henderson County School Projects

Henderson County School Staff: We continue to assist the Henderson County School staff with facility projects on an asneeded basis.

Also as requested and mandated by the Board of Commissioners, a spreadsheet report for all Henderson County School Capital Projects is included as an attachments to this report. The spreadsheet is a listing, inclusive of cost estimates, for all proposed and projected future Henderson County School Capital Projects. The listing highlights projects that were initially planned for the fiscal year 2012-2013 totaling \$1,004,900, but also highlights a reduced scope of projects for the year totaling \$500,000. The reduced scope was mandated to school operations by the HC School Board and includes what they considered to be the highest priority projects. At this time all of the four high priority projects

are either underway or being bid. One additional paving project (added and included in the allocated \$500,000) has been completed. A more current school project spreadsheet inclusive of exact project statuses is scheduled to be generated and released later this month. Any additional project information contained in the new report will be included in the next Construction Project Update.

Henderson County Projects

1995 Courthouse: Final directives and design proposals in regard to the needs for added security within the 1995 Courthouse, secured Courthouse parking, and designs for the relocation of the HC Tax Department within the Courthouse are expected to be forthcoming. While awaiting these design proposals and directives, more secure measures addressing entering/exiting the Courthouse have been initiated and installed. The metal detector has been relocated from the second floor to the ground floor. All persons entering the courthouse are now required to enter through the north side door and, if not recognized as court authorities or employees of the county, must pass through the metal detector device. They are allowed to exit through any of the exterior doors. These necessary modifications were planned jointly with the Sheriff's Department and Central Services involved. Central Services Department performed the construction and equipment relocation allowing for cost to be kept to a minimum. Also as per the Sheriff's Department request the keying of the doors is being changed. Other measures and studies of increasing the existing security within the building are also being investigated and will be addressed and included as a part of the final added security design.

Law Enforcement Center/911: Approval was obtained from the Board of Commissioners to proceed with an RFQ (Request for Qualifications) to procure an architectural firm to design the 911

Center that will be located in the basement area of the newly completed Law Enforcement Center. A specific section of the unfinished basement area was designated for this purpose in the original design of the building. The RFQ was posted the first week of July. The submitted RFQ's were received and are being reviewed by an evaluation committee that includes myself, County Engineer Marcus Jones, and Director of Communications Lisha Corn. A design team recommendation is being construed and will be forthcoming to the Board of Commissioners

2010 Solid Waste Capital Improvements: Cooper Construction, the general contractor, completed the final phases of the project inclusive of all punch list items. All aspects and improvements included in the scope of the project are currently successfully up and running. Additionally and in efforts to make the facility even more productive, attractive, and functional, the Henderson County Central Services staff has and continues to work with the Solid Waste staff on associated smaller project needs and repairs at the facility at no significant additional cost to the county. In particular, the Solid Waste garage facility has been significantly improved by upgrading tools, equipment, and the building itself in order to better maintain Solid Waste's heavy equipment. The Central Services garage staff is responsible for these improvements and by doing so is better able to minimize the outsourcing of equipment repairs at significant cost savings to the county. Also additional signage has been installed making the facility more attractive and user friendly.

Park Maintenance Projects: Note worthy park projects at this time would include the addition and much talked about handicap swings at several park locations and dugout improvements at Jackson Park fields #8 and #9 allowing for wheelchair participants. Volunteers in conjunction with the Parks and Recreation

Department and Central Service worked together to make this a successful project. While the materials funding for the dugout improvements was shared, the swings and all of the dugout improvements labor was provided for by the volunteers.

Central Services Planned & Special Projects: Planned 2012-2013 projects include King Street building roof drains installations, King Street parking lot repair/paving, carpet replacement at the main library, and EMS Station #1 bay garage door replacements. All of these projects are now in the planning stages. In addition to these planned projects Central Services has completed several other in-house requested departmental projects at no additional labor cost to the county. These projects include the recently completed renovations to the HC Wellness Center and the 1995 Courthouse Superior Courtroom. Other planned in-house projects that will soon be performed or coordinated by Central Services Department include the installation housing of the Sheriff's Department new drug incinerator into a free standing carport structure next to the Impound Building, and the relocation housing of the Sheriff's Departments firearms simulator from the basement of the LEC to the Impound Building.

Travel and Tourism Special Projects: Assistance is being provided to Travel and Tourism and a selected local architect, Jes Stafford, for a grounds improvement project that includes an all new permanent outdoor stage, improved parking lot/spectator area, lighting, and landscaping. Funds were previously approved and preliminary plans and renderings are completed pending Authority approval. We have also assisted Travel and Tourism with the bidding for new HVAC systems for the main portion of their building. A contractor will be selected and recommended this week.

Blue Ridge Community College

The completed project work inclusive of all associated cost was previously completed for less than the allocated HC two million dollar funding. This allowed for several additional scope components that were originally planned for, but were taken out due to initial cost concerns, to be planned and performed as a part of the overall project. The additional work was primarily paving/drainage of some parking lot areas. This additional work has now been completed and this successful project has now been closed out.
