SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

Based on the amount of information currently published, the impact of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act at the local EMS level is ambiguous at best. Even though specific EMS related components were seldom mentioned in the health care reform legislation, anything evoking a major change to the overall health care system will ultimately affect local EMS systems. In order to properly understand the effects of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act on emergency medical services we need time for a comprehensive study of the intended and potential unintended consequences.

BOARD ACTION REQUESTED:

Staff suggests the Board consider deferral of any changes to the EMS system until a careful and comprehensive study of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act can be completed.
