BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MONDAY, DECEMBER 7, 2015

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled organizational meeting at 5:30 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

Those present were: Commissioner Tommy Thompson, Commissioner Charlie Messer, Commissioner Grady Hawkins, Commissioner Mike Edney, Commissioner William Lapsley, County Manager Steve Wyatt, Assistant County Manager Amy Brantley, Attorney Russ Burrell and Clerk to the Board Teresa Wilson.

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME/INVOCATION

Attorney Russ Burrell called the meeting to order, welcomed all in attendance, and provided the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag was led by Reagan Gage, and members of the Horticulture 4-H Club.

ELECTION OF CHAIR

County Attorney Russ Burrell stated according to Section 153A-39 of the North Carolina General Statutes, on the first regular meeting of this Board during December of odd-numbered years, this Board must select a chairman. The chairman will serve until a successor is elected on the first Monday evening of December in 2016. After the chairman is selected, he will preside over the meeting.

Mr. Burrell opened the floor for nominations.

Commissioner Lapsley nominated Tommy Thompson.

Hearing no further nominations, Commissioner Edney made the motion to close nominations and accept the appointment of Tommy Thompson as Chairman by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIR

Chairman Thompson nominated Commissioner Messer for vice-chairman.

Hearing no further nominations, Commissioner Hawkins made the motion to close nominations and accept the appointment of Charlie Messer as vice-chairman. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

74TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ATTACK ON PEARL HARBOR

Chairman Thompson introduced Commissioner "Colonel" Hawkins. Colonel Hawkins explained the video played prior to the start of the meeting was a tribute as today marks the 74th Anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. A moment of silence was observed.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Public Hearing for consideration to abandon state maintenance and permanently close a portion of Middleton Road (SR 1136)


Commissioner Messer made the motion to go into Public Hearing for consideration to abandon state maintenance and permanently close a portion of Middleton Road (SR 1136). All voted in favor the motion carried.

Senior Planner Autumn Radcliff stated the Henderson County Board of Commissioners passed a resolution at the November 2, 2015 board meeting stating their intent to hold a public hearing for the purpose of permanently closing a portion of Middleton Road (SR 1136).

The Village of Flat Rock adopted a resolution in support on October 8, 2015.


North Carolina General Statute 153A-241 requires that a public hearing be held for the permanent closing of a public road or easement and that the board must adopt an order closing the right-of-way if it deems no individual owning property would be deprived of a reasonable means of ingress and egress.

North Carolina General Statute 136-63 provides that any group of petitioners may request for the abandonment of any road in the secondary system when in the best interest of the people of the county will be best served thereby.



Steve Cannon of the NCDOT was available to answer questions.






Pictures taken from the Intersection of Middleton Road and Old Town Way at the Entrance of Pleasant Hill Subdivision






Pictures taken on Middleton Road Looking at DOT Bridge Scheduled for Replacement



Public Comment

- 1) Wells Shealy Mr. Shealy began the process of closing the state maintenance of a portion of Middleton Road because the state was looking to build a new bridge. The new bridge would block access to 40 acres of his land which would put his family out of business.
- Dan Ravenel Mr. Ravenel owns the land deeded to Elruda, LLC, named for his children. He would like to keep the little traveled road, named after his uncle, just as it is. He noted Mr. Wells Shealy has agreed to maintain the road.
- 3) Mark Stierwalt Mr. Stierwalt stated Mr. Shealy will turn the road into a greenway for walkers, hikers, etc. The area is surrounded by developments. The walking path will be greatly used and will be much safer.
- 4) Barbara Ehrlich Mrs. Ehrlich and her husband live on Patriot Drive. They walk on this road and want to make sure they will still have access.

Commissioner Lapsley explained with the abandonment of state maintenance, the land owners will then have control of the property. There is a public easement at this time, but if the property was sold, this could change. He suggested that all property owners sign an agreement of unrestricted access to the property. The Board of Commissioners has no authority for the access.

Commissioner Hawkins clarified that the Board of Commissioners does not approve the closure, only a recommendation is sent to Raleigh.

Commissioner Hawkins made the motion to go out of public hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Edney made the motion that the Board approves recommending abandonment of state maintenance and closure of the right-of-way and certify the Order of Closure. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Public Hearing for Rezoning Application #R-2015-04-C Jeff Lemmons

Commissioner Hawkins made the motion to go into public hearing for Rezoning Application #R-2015-04-C. All voted in favor and the motion carried.


Planner Kyle Guie stated Rezoning Application #R-2015-04-C which was initiated on September 1, 2015 at the request of applicant, Jeffrey Lemmons, who requests the County rezone approximately 2.93 acres of land (thereafter the "Subject Area") from Residential One (R1) to Industrial Conditional District (I-CD) zoning district.

The Henderson County Planning Board considered rezoning application #R-2015-04-C at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 19, 2015. During that meeting, the Planning Board voted unanimously to send forward a favorable recommendation to rezone the Subject Area to an Industrial-Conditional District (I-CD) zoning district.


PUBLIC NOTICE:

In accordance with §42A-314(C) and §42A-337(B) of the Henderson County Land Development Code and State Law, notices of the December 7, 2015, public hearing regarding rezoning application #R-2015-04-C were published in the Hendersonville Tribune on November 26, 2015 and December 3, 2015. The Planning Department sent notices of the hearing via first class mail to the owners of properties adjacent to the Subject Area and the Subject Area property owner on November 20, 2015 and posted signs advertising the hearing on the Subject Area on November 20, 2015.


Aerial photo map




2020 CCP Future Land Use Map



Current zoning map





Public Comment

- 1) Jeff Lemmons Mr. Lemmons is a mechanical and electrical contractor on the adjacent site. He currently has 20 employees and needs to expand his business to a 7000 square foot building. Mr. Lemmon's business is growing and he would like to add a showroom. He doesn't feel the traffic would increase.
- 2) Joseph Garren Mr. Garren does not want a business is the residential area. He owns the adjoining property.
- 3) Donnie Garren Mr. Garren's family hunts in this area and he feels the commercial building will run off the wildlife. There will be too much traffic. A business in the residential area will only bring in trouble. There is only one road to the area and it has always been residential and farming land.
- 4) Alex Freeman Mr. Adam Accoson spoke on behalf of Mr. Freeman Mr. Accoson commended Mr. Lemmons, but doesn't want a business here in the residential area. He feels traffic will increase ten times, and is concerned with the entrance. There are small children who walk in the area. There is no water or sewer, but there are many endangered plants that could be destroyed. Animal life is abundant. He feels Mr. Lemmons needs to find a new location that has more room for his business.

Commissioner Hawkins made the motion to go out of public hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Edney made the motion to deny the request to rezone -subject property from (R1) Residential One to (I-CD) Industrial conditional District. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

RECOGNITION - HONORING CHIEF DEPUTY JERRY RICE

The Henderson County Sheriff's Office requests the Board of Commissioner adopt a Resolution Honoring Chief Deputy Jerry Rice for 28 years of Law Enforcement Service, and that his service badge and sidearm be given to him in recognition of that service and his retirement from the Henderson County Sheriff's Office.

Chief Deputy Jerry Rice began employment with the Henderson County Sheriff's Office on July 30, 1987. Throughout his career he has worked as a Deputy, Corporal, Sergeant, Lieutenant, Captain, Major, and Chief Deputy. Chief Deputy Rice has served for a total of 28 years in the Sheriff's Office. He has spent his adult life

serving our community and agency. To honor him and show their gratitude, the Sheriff's Department intends to present his service badge and service sidearm to him.

Sheriff McDonald makes this request on behalf of the Henderson County Sheriff's Office pursuant to North Carolina General Statute 20-187.2(a).

Sheriff McDonald was in Raleigh and unable to attend the meeting. Chairman Thompson shared a letter from Sheriff McDonald as follows:

"It is a great honor for me to request that the service weapon of Chief Deputy Jerry Rice be presented to him upon his retirement from the Henderson County Sheriff's Office as a small token of deep appreciation for 28 years of selfless service and sacrifice he has given to Henderson County. Not only has Jerry served me well in his last assignment, as Chief Deputy, but he and I have enjoyed a deep friendship that began shortly after he came to work at the Sheriff's Office. Jerry and I worked together in the Drug Enforcement Unit on various undercover operations, SWAT operations and served together as detectives in Criminal Investigations and firearms instructors. It was during that time that I learned to trust his instincts, skills and integrity. Jerry possesses a strong legal mind and has always stayed abreast of current laws on search and seizure as well as any other legislation that effects law enforcement. It was those qualities coupled with the strong leadership skills I have observed him demonstrate over the years that led me to appoint me as my Chief Deputy. Jerry has always had my total confidence and while I support his decision to retire after serving so honorably for so many years, he will be greatly missed not only by me but by all of the men and women of Henderson County Sheriff's Office. Jerry is retiring from the Sheriff's Office, but he will always have a place in my heart as one of my most loyal and trusted friends. It is my hope that he will continue to be involved with this agency to whatever degree he chooses.

Although I had to be in Raleigh this evening so am unable to appear personally before the Board, I respectfully request that the Board of Commissioners approve my request to have his assigned service weapon presented to him. I further respectfully request that all present rise and give him a big round of applause for his long and honorable career as a Deputy Sheriff of Henderson County and wish him a his wife Debbie, the best of all things in the years ahead."

Chairman Thompson read the resolution aloud and presented it to Chief Deputy Jerry Rice. Everyone rose and a tremendous round of applause was given in his honor.

Chairman Thompson made the motion that the Board allows Sheriff Charles McDonald to present the service badge and sidearm as a token of appreciation to Chief Deputy Jerry Rice. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Chairman Thompson pulled the service badge and sidearm request for Master Deputy Scott Justus from consent.

The YTD deficit in the CDBG – Dodd Meadows Project Fund is temporary and due to a timing delay between the expenditure of grant funds on the project and the subsequent reimbursement of expended funds from the Division of Community Assistance.

The YTD deficit in the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Fund is from the transfer of the remaining funds available to the County's General Fund due to completion of participation in this federal program by the Sheriff's Department. Final ICE Program funding ceased as of December 31, 2014.

The YTD deficit in the Westfeldt Park Project is due to the payment of project expenditures and the subsequent reimbursement of grant funds from the NCDENR – Recreational Trails Grant Program.

The YTD deficit in the Cane Creek Water & Sewer District Fund is due to ongoing sewer capital project expenditures. A total of \$2.478 million in fund balance, primarily for these capital projects, was budgeted to balance this Fund and cover these expenditures in the current fiscal year.

Review of Public Officials' Bond

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §58-72-20 (and the Board's Rules of Procedure), the next order of business at the Board's annual organizational meeting is the annual review and approval of the size and issuer of the bonds for county public officials.

Under §58-72-20:

The bonds of the officers named in G.S. 58-72-10 shall be carefully examined on the first Monday in December of every year, and if it appears that the security has been impaired, or for any cause become insufficient to cover the amount of money or property or to secure the faithful performance of the duties of the office, then the bond shall be renewed or strengthened, the insufficient security increased within the limits prescribed by law, and the impaired security shall be made good; but no renewal, or strengthening, or additional security shall increase the penalty of said bond beyond the limits prescribed for the term of office.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AND AGREEMENT

This Memorandum is made by and between the Henderson County Board of Public Education ("the School Board") and the Henderson County ("the County"), acting through its Board of Commissioners, to memorialize the terms of their agreement. The parties have agreed as follows:

- 1. The County will contract to construct a new facility on the campus of Blue Ridge Community College, a portion of which will be leased to the School Board for a term of fifty (50)years to house school functions, including but not limited to, classes and offices currently operated by the School Board on the campus of the former "Balfour Elementary" school site, located at 2529 Asheville Highway, Hendersonville, North Carolina (Deed Book 824, at Page 213, Henderson County Registry), hereafter "the Balfour site" and "the Lease". As a condition precedent to the effectiveness of this Agreement, the Lease shall be agreed upon between all necessary parties as required by applicable law.
- 2. The School Board will immediately, upon execution of a) the Lease and b) the construction contract by the County convey to the County the Balfour site, without further consideration required.

Bid award for Purchase of Sheriff Patrol Vehicles

The Board is requested to approve the low bid and authorize the Sheriff to proceed with purchasing eleven (11) 2016 Dodge Vehicles to include; three (3) Chargers, six (6) Durangos and two (2) RAM trucks. Bidding was conducted between November 2 and November 9, 2015. The low bidder was Hendersonville Chrysler Dodge Jeep RAM for a total price of \$294,374.

All eleven (11) vehicles were approved as part of the Sheriff's Fiscal Year 2016 budget and meet the Henderson County Vehicle Replacement Plan criteria.

Motion:

I move the Henderson County Board of Commissioners accept the low bid from Hendersonville Chrysler Jeep Dodge RAM for eleven 2016 Dodge Vehicles and authorize the purchase.

Henderson County Title VI Program

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA), under the US Department of Transportation, requires all transit recipients of financial assistance from FTA to adopt a Title VI Plan. Under Title VI, Federal funding agencies require compliance in order to receive FTA financial assistance.

Henderson County's Title VI plan is a Federal statute that states no person shall be discriminated against, excluded from participation, denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination due to race, color, or national origin. Title VI falls under the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and covers all of the operations of entities without regard to whether specific portions of the activities are federally funded.

December 7, 2015

Henderson County is a sub-recipient of FTA funds and reports to the primary recipient, the City of Asheville. Under Title VI sub-recipients shall submit Title VI plans to the primary recipient in order to assist the primary recipient with compliance. The City of Asheville requires Henderson County for Apple Country Transit to update and adopt a new Title VI plan every three (3) years. The Title VI plan must be approved by the direct or primary recipient's governing officials prior to submission to FTA.

The Title VI plan is dated May 2014 and has been adopted by the City of Asheville. At that time, the City of Asheville did not require the Board of Commissioners to adopt the Title VI plan. In order to meet all of FTA's requirements and the upcoming Triennial Review, the City of Asheville has requested the Board of Commissioners adopt the current Title VI policy.

SALES TAX REFERENDUM

Commissioner Edney stated Legislation passed by the N.C. General Assembly has given counties the option of a local-option, quarter-cent sales tax. The sales tax (G.S. 105-535) must be approved by voters in a referendum before it can be adopted by a county. This referendum, if approved, would bring in approximately \$2.5m per year for capital improvements.

The North Carolina Board of Elections has informed local election boards of its preference for local referendum to be finalized by not later than December 14, 2015. In order to meet this deadline, the Board of Commissioners is requested to discuss whether it wishes to include a quarter-cent local sales tax referendum on the March 15, 2016 State-wide primary ballot. Should the Board determine that it does wish to include that referendum, the Board of Commissioners will make that official request to the local Board of Elections.

If was the consensus of the Board to wait until the November 8, 2016 election for the sales tax referendum. This would allow time to make the citizens aware of capital projects and the intention of the sales tax referendum.

Commissioner Edney made the motion that the Board officially requests the inclusion of a quarter cent local sales tax referendum on the November 8, 2016 State-wide primary ballot. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT

Steve Wyatt noted for a point of clarification, the County anticipates a substantial amount of money to fund the academy and other priorities. It is illegal to borrow money for operational cost such as teacher supplements, as discussed during public comments. A teacher supplement increase as requested would require an approximate 15% tax increase.

CLOSED SESSION

The Board is requested to go into closed session pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §143-318.11(a)(3), (5) & (6) to consult with an attorney employed or retained by the Board to preserve attorney-client privilege. This consultation is with regard to a specific case, namely *Shelley v. County of Henderson et al.*, currently pending in the Henderson County Superior Court.

To establish, or to instruct the staff or agendas, concerning the position to be taken by or on behalf of the County in negotiating the price and other material terms of a contract or proposed contract for the acquisition of real property by purchase, option, exchange or lease.

To consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, conditions of appointment, or conditions of initial employment of an individual public officer or employee or prospective public officer or employee, or to hear or investigate a complaint, charge or grievance against an individual public officer or employee.

Commissioner Edney made the motion that the Board go into closed session pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §143-318.11(a)(3), (5) & (6) for the reasons set out in the Request for Board Action in the Board's agenda packet. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

ADJOURN

Commissioner Messer made the motion to go out of closed session and adjourn at 8:15 p.m. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

ORDER CLOSING A PORTION OF

RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR MIDDLETON ROAD

THIS MATTER came on for hearing before the Henderson County Board of Commissioners at its regular December 7, 2015, meeting, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §153A-241, on the issue of closing a portion of right-of-way for Middleton Road, and was heard by the Board after public hearing. The Board of Commissioners makes the following findings:

- 1. This matter first came before the Board of Commissioners on at the Board's regular meeting on November 2, 2015, on the petition of R. Wells Shealy to close a portion of Middleton Road in the Flat Rock area of Henderson County.
- 2. At the Board's November 2, 2015, the Board adopted a resolution "declaring its intent to close" the said portion of Middleton Road.
- 3. A map showing the area under consideration is shown on the attachment hereto, Exhibit A, (indicated by a broken yellow line).
- 4. A notice of this Board's December 7 hearing was published once a week for three successive weeks before the hearing in the *Hendersonville Tribune*, a copy of the resolution was sent by registered or certified mail to each owner as shown on the county tax records of property adjoining the public road or easement who did not join in the request to have the road or easement closed, and a notice of the closing and public hearing to be prominently posted in at least two places along the road or easement.
- 5. Before the Board on December 7, the Board heard "all interested persons who appear with respect to whether the closing would be detrimental to the public interest or to any individual property rights" are required by N.C. Gen. Stat. §153A-241.
 - 6. After such hearing, the Board is satisfied and finds:
 - A. That closing the public road or easement is not contrary to the public interest; and,
 - B. That no individual owning property in the vicinity of the road or in the subdivision in which it is located would thereby be deprived of reasonable means of ingress and egress to his property.

WHEREFORE IT IS ORDERED that a portion of Middleton Road in the Flat Rock area of Henderson County as shown on the attached map is hereby closed. It is further ordered that a private driveway easement be provided to the home on the property owned by Elruda LLC (Henderson County Parcel ID Number 9567228402) and that a certified copy of this Order shall be filed in the office of the register of deeds of the county.


