### **SUMMARY OF REQUEST:**

The Henderson County Department of Public Health would like to expand its current efforts to prevent prescription drug overdoses. The effort would be supported by funds from the NC Division of Public Health (see agreement addendum).

The initiative and related budget amendment were discussed and approved by the Henderson County Board of Health at their October 11, 2016 meeting.

**I. Background:**

*As of October 1, 2016, this Agreement Addendum Revision #1 adds the following paragraph:*

Naloxone (commercially known as Narcan or Evzio) is a safe, non-addictive antidote for an opioid overdose. In April 2013, North Carolina state law increased access to naloxone as a first aid tool in drug overdoses. The law also allows local health departments to distribute naloxone through a standing order/organizational policy under the direction of a medical director, provides legal immunity to naloxone prescribers, and provides limited legal immunity for bystanders who administer naloxone for opioid reversal (Good Samaritan Law/Naloxone Access <http://www.ncleg.net/Sessions/2013/Bills/Senate/PDF/S20v7.pdf>).

**II. Purpose:**

This Agreement Addendum Revision #1 provides additional funding to enable the Local Health Department to provide the additional services as described in Section III below.

**III. Scope of Work and Deliverables:**

*As of October 1, 2016, this Agreement Addendum Revision #1 adds Paragraph 5, as follows:*

5. Select at least two of the five activities below and complete the activities by May 31, 2017. Notify the DPH Program Contact about which the activities have been chosen no later than October 5, 2016.

- a. The Local Health Department shall establish a medical standing order and protocols to delegate the distribution of naloxone from the Health Department Medical Director to a trained pharmacist, public health nurse, home visitor, or health educator and shall provide training in the use of naloxone to staff.

Establishment of naloxone standing orders enables public health staff to legally distribute to and train family members and individuals associated with patients at high risk for an opioid overdose on how to administer naloxone. - b. Promote, under the State Health Director's Standing Order for naloxone:

1. The statewide naloxone standing order for pharmacies and encourage pharmacies to sign-on to distribute.
2. The availability of naloxone through North Carolina pharmacies and the website [www.naloxonesaves.org](http://www.naloxonesaves.org) to the general public. This website includes a searchable map of all pharmacy locations who are signed on to dispense naloxone under the statewide standing order.
3. Through outreach, in order to increase the number of providers in its community that prescribe naloxone and the number of pharmacies that stock the medication.

- c. Train medical professionals and pharmacists on safer and proper prescribing and dispensing of opioids. Training sessions will include information on assessment of opioid abuse, appropriate prescribing practices, and actions providers can take to be a part of the solution. The Governor's Institute on Substance Abuse is actively planning training events throughout the state.
