- d. Contain a declaration of intent of the district board to conform with the plans set forth in the report in extending sewerage services to the territory proposed to be included; and a certification by the chairman of the district board to the effect that the matters and things set forth in the report are true to his knowledge or belief.
- (i) Immediately following the inclusion of any additional political subdivision within an existing district, members representing such additional political subdivision shall be appointed to the district board in the manner provided in this section:
 - 1) Any additional unincorporated area that is included within an existing district shall be represented by the members representing the county in which the unincorporated area lies as follows:
 - If inclusion of the additional unincorporated area extends the district into more than one county, members representing the unincorporated area in the new county shall be appointed immediately following the inclusion of the additional area. Upon the inclusion of the additional the board members appointed in accordance G.S. 162A-67(a)(1) or G.S. 162A-67(a)(1a) shall continue to serve on the district board. The board of commissioners of the county in which the largest portion of the district lies shall appoint qualified voters residing in the county and district as their successors such that the county in which the largest portion of the district lies shall always have three members on the district board. The board of commissioners of the county in which the lesser portion of the district lies shall appoint to the district board two qualified voters residing in the county and district to serve a term of three years and shall appoint qualified voters residing in the county and district as their successors such that the county in which the lesser portion of the district lies shall always have two members on the district board. For purposes of this subdivision, the county in which the largest portion and lesser portion of the district lies shall be determined with reference to the land area of the district lying within the county as a percentage of land area of the entire district at the time such appointment or reappointment is made.
 - b. If the inclusion of the additional unincorporated area has the effect of changing the county in which the largest portion of the district lies, new members representing the county comprising the larger portion of the district shall be appointed in accordance with G.S. 162A-67(a)(2) immediately following the inclusion, and no reappointment shall be made by the county in which the lesser portion of the district lies upon expiration of the first term of a member representing that county following the inclusion.
 - (1a) Notwithstanding subdivision (1) of this subsection, when the territory of the district is expanding into new territory, any county without representation on the district board shall be represented by three additional members who are qualified voters residing within the new territory, appointed by the county board of commissioners governing the new territory.
 - (2) Following Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, following the inclusion of any additional political subdivision within an existing district,

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the political subdivisions added shall appoint members to the district board
in accordance with G.S. 162A-67(a)(4) only if the governing body of the
political subdivision owns or operates a public system for the collection of
wastewater at the time of such appointment.

The terms of office of the members first appointed under subsection (i) of this (i) section to represent such additional political subdivision or area may be varied for a period not to exceed six months from the terms provided for in G.S. 162A-67, so that the appointment of successors to such members may more nearly coincide with the appointment of successors to members of the existing board; and all successor members shall be appointed for the terms provided for in G.S. 162A-67."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to any expansion of a metropolitan sewerage district on or after that date.

AT THE CONCLUSION OF OUR LAST UPDATE ON APRIL 3, 2017, THE COUNTY MANAGER POSED THE FOLLOWING QUESTION:

Are you confident that the software will allow the County to facilitate a successful 2019 Reappraisal?

WHAT TYPES OF ISSUES ARE WE EXPERIENCING?

- At the April 3 meeting, we reported a total of 77 unresolved issues.
- Now, there are approximately 100 unresolved issues.
- The number of issues has increased because (1) more issues have been identified as we move forward with our daily business processes; and (2) observation of issues by Farragut's onsite Project Manager.
- Issues are categorized as "Critical", "Major" or "Minor"
- "Critical" issues materially impede the operation of the entire software or major portions of the County's business operations and a workaround* is not available
- "Major" issues have a substantial impact on business processes and a workaround* is available or the function can be completed on a limited basis
- * A "workaround" is a temporary way to circumvent a software issue until a permanent fix is implemented. "Minor" issues have a minor impact on business processes or may be enhancement requests

THE ANSWER TO THE COUNTY MANAGER'S QUESTION POSED ON **APRIL 3, 2017:**

NO. At this time we cannot state that we have confidence in the ability of our current CAMA system to perform functions necessary to achieve a successful 2019 Reappraisal.

WHAT STEPS WILL THE TAX DEPARTMENT TAKE TO IMPROVE THE SITUATION?

- Reallocation of Staff to ensure adequate Reappraisal staffing
- Appraisal Division. These two positions will be Real Property Appraisal I positions, and will enable appraisal Two vacant positions are being reallocated from another Tax Department Division, to the Real Property staff to visit new construction, process sales and review parcels for the purpose of Reappraisal.

- Mandatory participation in training provided by Farragut
- Training will be tailored based on input from staff.
- Testing will occur following training session to confirm employee comprehension.
- Tax Department Administration will present a Reappraisal Plan in the near future
- The Plan will include the focus of the Reappraisal, a timeline for the completion of each step required and the resources that will be dedicated to administering the Reappraisal.
- The Reappraisal Plan will also be forwarded to the Department of Revenue for review and comment.

AT A MINIMUM, WHAT DO WE NEED FROM THE VENDOR?

- Adherence to targeted completion dates for Milestones.
- Notices are typically mailed in February. System issues have prevented the Notices from being mailed until An example of a targeted completion date for a task is the generation of 2017 value change notices. April/May. They are being sent in two batches because of system issues.
 - Targeted completion dates have been established for identified Milestones, including the billing of annual tax bills, which usually occurs during July of each year. Our CAMA system must be reliable in order to maintain our annual cycle and to provide the service our taxpayers deserve. A
- Adequate training and problem resolution for staff.
- On-site instruction of staff.
- Reference material for the system's functions (user's manual, quick reference guides, etc.)
 - Ongoing support to complete tasks necessary for the 2019 Reappraisal. A
- Ensure that analytical tools (queries, statistical analysis tools, etc.) are working properly
 - Provide assistance to staff in the proper operation of these tools
- An unwavering commitment to fix all system issues completely and in a timely manner.
- Establish a schedule for completing tasks that will allow time to perform Reappraisal tasks
- Do not deviate from the schedule
