BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
DECEMBER 20, 1995

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room of the Henderson County Office Building.

Those present were: Chairman Renee Kumor, Vice-Chair Vollie G. Good, Commissioner J. Michael Edney, Commissioner Bob Eklund, Commissioner Don Ward, County Manager David F. Thompson, Assistant County Manager David E. Nicholson, County Attorney Don H. Elkins, Staff Attorney Angela M. Skerrett, and Clerk to the Board Elizabeth W. Corn.

Also present were: Finance Director Carey McLelland, Planning Director Matt Matteson, Planner Stuart Rohrbaugh, and Planner Karen Collins.

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Kumor called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Ward led the Pledge to the American Flag.

INVOCATION

Rev. Barbara Bloxsom, The Episcopal Church of Holy Family in Mills River, gave the invocation.

DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF AGENDA

Commissioner Edney made one addition as "J-1" Rate Study for Salaries at the Sheriff's Dept.

CONSENT AGENDA

Commissioner Eklund made the motion to approve the agenda. Consent Agenda included:

Review of Minutes

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Minutes were presented for review and approval for the following meetings: September 5, 1995; October 5, 1995; November 6, 1995; November 15, 1995; and December 7, 1995.

Tax Releases

Request for Improvement Guarantees - The Branigar Organization - Champion Hills - Section 2 A (Revised)

The Branigar Organization had submitted an application for improvement guarantees for water and sewer improvements for Champion Hills, Section 2A (Revised). The Preliminary Plan for this subdivision was approved by the Henderson County Planning Board on November 18, 1995.

The Branigar Organization plans to provide an Irrevocable Letter of Credit from First Citizens Bank in the amount of \$11187.50 which includes a 25% overhead factor. A draft agreement was reviewed.

INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENTS

- 1. Robert Hawksley Mr. Hawksley is a resident of Hawthorne Hills, phase II. He spoke in opposition of the Hodge rezoning request.
- 2. Dutch Burdette Mr. Burdette spoke in favor of the Hodge rezoning request.
- 3. Marjean Smith Ms. Smith passed around a hand-out regarding her comments. She spoke in opposition of the Hodge rezoning request.
- 4. RoAnn Bishop Ms. Bishop, Director of the Historic Johnson Farm, thanked the County Commissioners for their support of the

Johnson Farm this past year. Some of the Commissioners and other county staff have volunteered there at different times during the year.

<u>5. Allen Smith</u> - Mr. Smith spoke in opposition of the Hodge rezoning request.

UPDATE ON PENDING ISSUES/Request for Direction to the Chair

This is an effort to keep the lines of communication open. It offers the Chairman an opportunity to bring the Board up to date on issues that occur between meetings. It is also the time to ask for direction so that public positions on current and up coming topics can be developed.

It also offers the Commissioners an opportunity to report on related committee work and assignments.

The topics for this meeting were:

1. A statement mailed to the Chairman regarding EMS service rendered. Chairman Kumor read a letter of praise for Henderson County's EMS service and employees. The writer specifically asked that the letter be read aloud at a Commission meeting. It was from Jim & Brenda Spears.

Tom Edmundson, Director of EMS, stated that he wished to share the credit with the Fletcher First Responders that assisted on this call.

2. Position statement on Water supply Watershed Regulations. Chairman Kumor passed around a copy of a letter that she sent to Mr. Zoufaly. Mr. Thompson suggested that a copy of this letter be sent to the State Legislative Delegation asking them to support this with the Environmental Management Commission. It was the consensus of the Board to follow his suggestion.

1995 WNC DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION AWARDS

Two Resolutions were presented for approval by the Board in recognition of awards granted by the 1995 Western North Carolina development Association.

- 1. The Upper Hickory Nut Gorge Community Club received the award for first place in Division A of this competition for community cleanliness and beauty. Members of the Community Club were present and were congratulated.
- 2. Mrs. Betty Edwards, President of the East Flat Rock Community Club, was named "Woman of the Year" for her efforts in initiating the Tree House 4-H Club and volunteer services to the disadvantaged. She was present and was congratulated.

Commissioner Ward made the motion to adopt both Resolutions honoring these recipients. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

REOUEST - AWARD OF SERVICE FIREARM

Benjamin Hardy Freeman retired in November 1995 from the Henderson County Sheriff's Department with 24 years of creditable service with the Local Government Employees Retirement System. Sheriff George H. Erwin, Jr. has requested that Mr. Freeman be awarded his service firearm, a Colt .45, serial #SS30737, which Mr. Freeman carried and used in qualifying while on duty with the Sheriff's Department. Sheriff Erwin recommended this service firearm award in recognition of Mr. Freeman's years of service and in appreciation to Mr. Freeman's excellent employment record with Henderson County. Sheriff Erwin presented the service firearm to Mr. Freeman. Commissioner Edney made the motion to approve the Resolution awarding Mr. Freeman his service firearm. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Hardy Freeman received a round of applause and the Commissioners wished him well.

REQUEST TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF HENDERSON COUNTY APPLICATION #R-27-95, Submitted by Phillip Todd Moss

Mr. Phillip Todd Moss requested that the County amend the Official Zoning Map of Henderson County by rezoning approximately 12.5 acres of property located on Brevard Road (US 64 West) from an R-20 (Low Density Residential) district to a C-2 (Neighborhood Commercial) district. The study area defined on the application by Mr. Moss contains seven whole parcels and portions of two others under the ownership of nine different individuals or parties. Mr. Moss owns one of the nine parcels.

Karen Collins informed the Board that on November 28, 1995, the Henderson County Planning Board voted unanimously (9 to 0) to send the Board of Commissioners an <u>unfavorable recommendation</u> on the request for rezoning the study area to C-2 and the Planning Board also directed Planning Department staff to work with Mr. Moss to see if there are alternatives for him under the existing zoning.

The Board of Commissioners must hold a public hearing prior to taking action on this application. Monday, February 5 was the date that staff suggested for the Public Hearing.

Jack Tate, Attorney for Mr. Moss, presented the request on behalf of his client. He asked that the request be changed to rezone the study area O & I instead of the previously requested C-2. There was a question as to whether this request would have to go back to the Planning Board since it was a change in the request. The Planning Staff will make that call.

No action was taken at this time.

COMPREHENSIVE ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT COMPLIANCE AUDIT REPORT

The Henderson County Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for fiscal year ended June 30, 1995 was presented to the Board for information by Mr. James Carey McLelland.

Mr. McLelland also presented the Compliant Audit Report for the Board's information. No action was required.

These documents are available at the Henderson County Public Library for public inspection. They are also available at the Henderson County Finance Department.

Mr. Randy Brodd discussed available fund balance and the fact that the LGC recommends 8%. Henderson County presently has 5.5% and he strongly suggested increasing that.

Mr. McLelland read some recommendations for improvement from the Accounting Firm, Dixon, Odom and Company, Inc. L.L.P.

Chairman Kumor called a short recess.

PRESENTATION OF HENDERSON COUNTY SCHOOLS

December 20, 1995

10 YEAR FACILITIES NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Dr. Dan Lunsford, School Superintendent, discussed the School Capital Construction Survey. The General Assembly appointed a study commission to review school construction needs statewide.

The Board of Commissioners was asked to approve of the <u>submission</u> only of the local survey. The survey does not bind Henderson County to any local funding but is a listing of the local needs identified by the Board of Public Education in Henderson County.

Commissioner Edney made the motion to approve the *submission* of the survey *only* with a cover letter stating that because of the state imposed deadlines the Board had not had time to review it. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Chairman Kumor requested that David Thompson and Dr. Lunsford convene and offer a series of meetings with a break down of the study of these facilities so that the Board of Commissioners is up to date on what is being discussed.

Tom Orr, Chairman of Board of Education, came forward and thanked the Board and stated that he looks forward to meeting with the Board of Commissioners and discussing the school needs.

RATE INCREASE ARC'ANGEL TRANS'SUPPORT SERVICE

Tom Edmundson reminded the Board that in May of this year, the Board granted a non-exclusive franchise for the operation of a non-emergency transport service pursuant to the "Ordinance for the Operation of Ambulance Service in Henderson County, North Carolina" to the Odin Corporation d/b/a/ Arc'Angel Trans'Support Service. As a part of the franchise, Arc'Angel's rates for transport service were approved. Section 3.10 allows a fee of \$95.00 per one way trip, \$47.50 for a return trip, and \$5.00 each way if oxygen is used. Arc'Angel has requested to raise their rates for service to \$125.00 for one way trip and \$80.00 per return trip. This increase may enable Arc'Angel to get a higher rate of reimbursement from Medicare. Mr. Edmundson recommended the increase.

Jack Tate presented the request on behalf of his client, Mr. Aaron Edney (owner of Arc'Angel).

As a comparable, Henderson County EMS currently charges \$175.00 for a one-way trip, \$87.50 for a return trip, and an additional \$5.00 fee for oxygen each way.

Following discussion, Commissioner Edney made the motion to approve the rate modification for Arc'Angel Trans'Support Service as requested. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

AMBULANCE FRANCHISE (Medical Emergency Ambulance Transport)

Medical Emergency Ambulance Transport Inc. requested franchises to provide:

- 1. Convalescence non-emergency transport service
- 2. Emergency transport service

The Ordinance requires separate applications for each but all documentation is the same; therefore, both were submitted at this time.

Mr. Tom Edmundson, EMS Director, was made responsible for reviewing the franchise application for compliance with our Ordinance. He was present and answered many questions.

Mr. Edmundson stated that he would be back with a franchise agreement in about 30 days. The presentation today was for information only.

ADDITION OF MATERNAL OUTREACH WORKER (MOW) POSITION

Barbara Stanley, Health Nurse, informed the Board that many of the pregnant patients the Health Department is caring for have special needs and problems coping with their conditions related to their health, the health of their unborn baby, and preparations for raising a child or children under difficult conditions. These patients are being assisted by Health Department nurses, but some need more attention and assistance than the nurses have time to provide. Some of their needs can be met by lower paid paraprofessionals which the State calls Maternal Outreach Workers (MOW).

These staff are paid less than nurses and can be trained to help the high-risk pregnant patients arrange for transportation to their appointments, train them to practice good nutrition for themselves and their infants, follow up on missed appointments, and assist with arranging for housing needs while they are pregnant and after the baby is born.

The State has funding available from the Reynolds Foundation to use as start-up funding and Medicaid will reimburse the Health Department for services after the program is under way.

The application for start-up funding is expected to be approved, effective January 1, 1996. No local funds were requested and are not planned to be requested in the future. Approval was requested to establish the new position to be funded by the Reynold's grant.

Following discussion, Commissioner Good made the motion to approve acceptance of the Reynold's Grant and the addition of the MOW position. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

SET WORK SESSION/PUBLIC HEARING FOR WATER SUPPLY WATERSHED ORDINANCE - "Test Only" Amendments

In August of 1995 the North Carolina Division of Environmental Management modified the State's Water Supply Watershed rules allowing local governments to make modifications to their respective ordinances. The Henderson County Planning Board reviewed and endorsed the modifications reviewed, all of which either clarify or relax regulations.

A Public Hearing is required before any amendments can be approved by the Board.

These text amendments are from the Planning staff, not from the State. Staff recommended a work session and a public hearing. It was the consensus of the Board to have a work session at the midmonth February meeting and then hold a Public Hearing later.

RATE STUDY FOR SALARIES - Sheriff's Department

Commissioner Edney attended the 1995 Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award ceremony on Saturday, December 16. While attending this function several individuals, including Sheriff George Erwin, voiced their opinion that the County does not sufficiently compensate our law enforcement personnel. In comments directed to Commissioner Edney, Sheriff Erwin suggested that the county should

increase the compensation to our law enforcement officers as soon as possible.

Mr. Edney stated that he respects Sheriff Erwin's opinion, and as such, did not take the request lightly. He does not believe that Sheriff Erwin would have made such a request unless he had taken the time to study the issue, including the comparison of salaries with the communities with which he competes for qualified, professional officers. Commissioner Edney felt the Board should address this concern as soon as possible. He requested that the Board direct the County Manager to meet with Sheriff Erwin to discuss his concerns.

Following discussion, Commissioner Edney made the motion to direct the Manager to get a study (for Sheriff's Department and the other county departments) for the Board to have for budget deliberations. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

REQUEST TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP APPLICATION #R-23-95 Submitted by Mr. Howard L. Rhodes

The Board of Commissioners held a Public Hearing on Monday, December 18, on this application. The request came before the Board at this time for action.

There was a debate of whether the property should be zoned C-1 or C-2. Karen Collins explained that C-1 is more restrictive as far as setbacks but does allow very similar uses as C-2 with the exception of light industry and shopping centers which are allowed with a special use permit in C-2. The Planning Board and Planning staff recommended C-2.

Following discussion, Commissioner Good made the motion to approve the request to amend the official zoning map as submitted by Mr.Rhodes to change the zoning from R-40 to C-2. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

AMENDMENT TO RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS FOR APPLELAND BUSINESS PARK

Angela Skerrett reminded the Board that on Monday, November 6, 1995, a public hearing was held to consider an amendment to the Restrictive Covenants for Appleland Business Park. The proposed amendment would require all Business Park owners to receive the approval of the Park Association before leasing any of their

property within the Business Park to another business. Currently, the Board of Commissioners is the Association. Pursuant to the terms of the Restrictive Covenants, Business Park Owners were given a period of thirty days after the public hearing within which to offer comments concerning the proposed amendments. In addition, any amendments must be approved by Cynthia Whitted. Staff has received comments from Henderson Oil Company indicating that the commercial areas of the Park should not be subject to this limitation. Staff proposed that this request be granted by exempting the commercial areas from the proposed amendment. Staff has confirmed with Mrs. Whitted's Attorney that this would be acceptable.

Staff recommended approval of the amendment to the Restrictive Covenants for Appleland Business Park to require the Association's approval before a Park Owner could lease any property owned within the Park, and to exempt the commercial areas from this requirement.

Following discussion, Commissioner Good made the motion to grant the request to exempt the commercial property from the proposed amendment and to grant approval of the amendment. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

COUNTY MANAGER'S UPDATE

David Thompson up-dated the Board on the following items/issues:

1. Amendments to the Regional Water Agreement

David Thompson reviewed the summary of proposed amendments to the Regional Water Agreement. The section that has received the most publicity is the change in **Section 3.6**.

Section 3.6 has been amended to remove any and all references to any obligation of Henderson County to request a WS-II classification for any watershed resulting from the proposed water intakes on either the Mills River or the French Broad River. Section 3.6 as amended simply requires each entity to "take all reasonable measures to protect and improve each associated watershed for the Mills River and French Broad Rivers in accordance with its classification, including, but not limited to, enforcement of all applicable watershed regulations."

At the request of bond counsel for the City of Asheville, Section 4.4 has been amended to add a condition upon which the validity of

the Regional Water Agreement is contingent. Previously, pursuant to Section 4.4, the Regional Water Agreement was contingent upon three things: the sale of the property in Mills River to the ABWA, the approval by the State of North Carolina of a water intake on the Mills River and/or French Broad River with a quantity of at least 10 million gallons per day, and the approval by the State of North Carolina of plans for treatment and separate storage of waters from the Mills and/or French Broad Rivers. The amendment adds a fourth condition: receipt of funds by Asheville and/or the ABWA for the construction of a 5 million gallon per day water treatment plant upon such terms and conditions as are acceptable to Asheville and ABWA. This was requested because Asheville and ABWA will assume all responsibility for repayment of any debt issued to finance the construction of the water treatment plant, and its associated facilities and improvements.

Mr. Thompson stated that the City of Asheville, ABWA, and Buncombe County have all signed off on the new amendments. If Henderson County does not execute the agreement, they will still be bound by the old agreement.

Commissioner Edney made the motion to approve the amendments as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

CANE CREEK WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT

Commissioner Edney moved the Board adjourn as the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and convene as the Cane Creek Board, adopt the amendments and adjourn as Cane Creek Water & Sewer District and reconvene as Henderson County Board of Commissioners. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

2. Request for Office Space

David Thompson informed the Board that Billy Ray Cameron, North Carolina Emergency Management Director is hiring a technician to support and monitor the integrated flow observation warning systems for the entire Western North Carolina region. These are the electronic indicators that you find at all major bridges when we have flooding situations. They have requested office space in the Land Development Building. It could be advantageous to us in that we could get some rental for a state office. We would also have someone in our county that would be the expert on these systems. If we relocate our emergency operations center in the future to another facility, it would be good to negotiate that cost of

construction with the state for help in that area. It was the consensus of the Board for the Manager to proceed.

3. Carolina Village Annexation Area

Mr. Thompson just wanted to bring to the Board's attention that annexation has become effective. He showed a map of the area.

4. Transfer of East Flat Rock School Property

Mr. Thompson was hoping to be able to give the Board a date for the transfer. The deeds haven't been prepared by the Board of Education as yet to transfer the ownership.

5. Transfer of Multi-Purpose Center Property

Mr. Thompson reminded the Board that the county had asked for an environment assessment on the proposed site. If we get financing an environment assessment would be a requirement. The wells were drilled last Friday and he anticipates results at any time now (preliminary test results). He is aiming for the transfer to take place by the end of January.

CLOSED SESSION

Commissioner Edney made the motion for the Board to go into Closed Session as allowed under NCGS 143-318.11 for the following reasons:

- 1. (a)(3) to consult with an attorney employed or retained by the public body in order to preserve the attorney-client privilege between the attorney and the public body, which privilege is hereby acknowledged. To consult with an attorney employed or retained by the public body in order to consider and give instructions to the attorney with respect to a claim.
- 2. (a) (5) To establish, or to instruct the public body's staff or negotiating agents concerning the position to be taken by or on behalf of the public body in negotiating (I) the price and other material terms of a contract or proposed contract for the acquisition or real property by purchase, option, exchange, or rlease.

All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Chairman Kumor made the motion for the Board to go out of Closed Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

NOMINATIONS

Chairman Kumor reminded the Board of the following vacancies and opened the floor to nominations:

- 1. Henderson County Zoning Board of Adjustment 1 vacancy
 There were no nominations at this time so this item was rolled to
 the next meeting. This vacancy must be filled with someone from
 the Haywood Zoning District.
- 2. Hendersonville City Zoning Board of Adjustment 1 vacancy Commissioner Edney nominated John Boyd. Commissioner Edney made the motion to suspend the rules and appoint Mr. Boyd to fill this one vacancy. All voted in favor and the motion carried.
- 3. Henderson County Travel and Tourism Committee 3 vacancies
 There were no nominations at this time so this item was rolled to
 the next meeting.
- 4. Henderson County Board of Health 2 vacancies
 There were no nominations at this time so this item was rolled to
 the next meeting.
- 5. Nursing Home/Domiciliary Home Advisory Committee 1 vacancy Chairman Kumor nominated Barbara Head. A vote will be taken at a later date as this is a designated position and a letter must first be sent to the nursing homes with the nominees names.
- 6. Hospital Board of Trustees 1 vacancy
 There were no nominations at this time so this item was rolled to the next meeting.
- 7. Downtown Hendersonville 1 vacancy

Chairman Kumor reminded the Board that Downtown Hendersonville Inc. will be working through City Hall and the Mayor will be an interim director as they reconfigure themselves. John Shiery as the new President of the Board has informed Chairman Kumor that the Board of Commissioners has two appointees. One of the appointees has another year to serve but the other is a vacancy. John Shiery suggested Myra Wood for appointment.

Commissioner Eklund nominated Myra Wood. Commissioner Eklund made the motion to suspend the rules and appoint Myra Wood. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING- Administration of Room Tax Funds

It was not clear previously whether the Board of Commissioners had accepted the amended Memorandum of Understanding with Travel & Tourism. The memorandum was reviewed. The only change from the past agreement was Board representation.

Chairman Kumor made the motion to adopt the Memorandum of Understanding. Commissioner Edney seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

IMPORTANT DATES

David Thompson stated that he has a draft report on the Hendersonville Airport. They are getting it into final form and he requested a joint work session with the Airport Advisory Board at 5:00 p.m. on January 2, prior to the 7:00 p.m. regularly scheduled meeting. The consultant would come and submit the report and get input from the Airport Advisory Board as well as the Commissioners.

The Board had set a February 21 Watershed Text Workshop.

WORK SESSION - CODIFICATION

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT MADE AND ENTERED INTO this the 20 day of December , 19 95 , by and between **The Branigar**Organization, hereinafter known as "The Subdivider", and the Henderson County Board of Commissioners, hereinafter known as "The Board."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Subdivider is attempting to secure from the Board approval of Final Plats of a proposed subdivision to be known as Champion Hills, Section 2A (Revised), located in Henderson County, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, a County Ordinance entitled Land Development Ordinance for the County of Henderson as adopted by the Board of Commissioners of Henderson County on the 8th day of February 1988, (and as subsequently amended), requires the completion of certain improvements prior to Final Plat approval; and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance allows the Board of Commissioners at its discretion, to permit the Subdivider to post with Henderson County an Irrevocable Letter of Credit from a banking corporation licensed to do business in North Carolina to guarantee the completion of said required improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board has previously approved with conditions the Preliminary Plan for said Subdivision and the Land Development Administrator desires to approve the Final Plat for said subdivision and, in lieu of requiring completion of all improvements prior to said approval, will accept from the Subdivider an Irrevocable Letter of Credit to guarantee and secure completion of said improvements.

IT IS THEREFORE, AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Subdivider will, on or before June 1, 1996, complete as required the following improvements in Champion Hills, Section 2A (Revised):
- a. Construction of waterline distribution system as shown on the plans titled Water Distribution System Improvements, Section 2A (Revised), dated 12/95 prepared by John Jeter of William G. Lapsley and Associates, P.A. Engineers & Land Planners Hendersonville, North Carolina job: 95186, said plans being incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein; and,

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- b. Construction of sewer improvements as shown on the plans titled Sanitary Sewer System Improvements, Section 2A (Revised), dated 12/95 prepared by John Jeter of William G. Lapsley and Associates, P.A. Engineers & Land Planners Hendersonville, North Carolina job: 95186, said plans being incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein (Subparagraphs a and b above collectively hereinafter referred to as "said improvements").
- 2. The Subdivider shall file with Henderson County an Irrevocable Letter of Credit issued by First Citizens Bank in the amount of \$11,187.50, securing and guaranteeing completion of said improvements by the required date with such Irrevocable Letter of Credit expiring at least 60 days after the above stated completion date; and,
- 3. When the Irrevocable Letter of Credit referred to in paragraph two above is reviewed and recommended for acceptance by the Henderson County Staff Attorney and all other requirements of said Land Development Ordinance are met, including any conditions specified by the Planning Board as part of the approval of the Preliminary Plan, then the Board will allow the Final Plat of Champion Hills, Section 2A (Revised), to be approved by the Land Development Administrator.
- 4. Upon completion of said improvements and subsequent inspection for satisfactory completion, Henderson County will release such guarantees. Release may be made in increments of not less than 25 percent, upon request by the developer, by the Henderson County Manager where, in the discretion of the County Manager, satisfactory progress towards completion of said improvements, roughly proportional to the release requested, has been made by The Subdivider.
- The developer may, in writing, request an extension of the 5. improvements completion date. The County Manager shall have the authority to grant the extension if the developer deposits with the County a new irrevocable letter of credit to guarantee the completion of required improvements. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ADMINISTRATION OF ROOM TAX FUNDS

The understanding is based on the assumption that Henderson County will be authorized to enact a room occupancy and tourism development tax. The provisions would be the same as those in the Western Counties Occupancy Tax enacted by the 1985 session of the NC Legislature (DRS 3609).

Section 1, paragraph (e) of this act is as follows:

Use of tax revenue. A taxing county shall place revenue collected from a tax levied under this act in a special Travel and Tourism Fund. Revenue in this fund may be used only to promote travel and tourism in the county.

The act does not enumerate the method by which such expenditures shall be controlled. The purpose of this memorandum is to outline a method of decision-making and control which provides accountability to the appropriate governing bodies, while at the same time minimizing administrative expense. Provisions are as follow:

- 1. The fund shall be administered by a special committee appointed by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and the Hendersonville City Council. This committee will be named Travel and Tourism Committee.
- 2. The committee shall be composed of nine (9) members (all of whom shall be registered voters of Henderson County) as follows:
 - a. Four (4) members appointed by the Hendersonville Council, one (1) of which shall be an owner or operator of a hotel, motel, or other taxable tourist accommodations.
 - b. Four (4) members appointed by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners, one (1) of which shall be an owner or operator of a hotel, motel or other taxable tourist accommodations.
 - c. One individual involved in the tourist business who has demonstrated an interest in tourism development, but who does **not** own or operate a motel, hotel, or other taxable tourist accommodation. This individual will be appointed by the Greater Hendersonville Chamber of Commerce.

- 3. All members of the committee shall serve without compensation. Vacancies on the committee shall be filled by the appointing authority of the member creating the vacancy. Members shall serve one-year terms, with reappointment at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Members shall serve no more than five consecutive years. Members shall elect a chairman at the beginning of each committee year. The committee shall meet at the call of the chairman or at the request of a majority of the members and shall adopt rules of procedure to govern its meetings. The committee shall meet no less often than 2 months.
- 4. The committee shall authorize a payment to Henderson County to cover actual costs of collecting the tax, not to exceed 5% of the total tax collected each year.
- 5. The committee shall report quarterly and at the close of the fiscal year to the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and to the Hendersonville City Council on its receipts and expenditures for the preceding quarter and for the fiscal year in such detail as the Boards may require. The committee shall submit an annual budget for the coming fiscal year to the two governing boards.
- 6. With respect to the expenditures of the funds by the committee, the scope of promotion of travel and tourism in the county may include the following:
 - a. Contracting with any person, firm or agency to advise and assist in travel and tourism promotion.
 - b. Advertising via appropriate media.
 - c. Contracting with the Greater Hendersonville Chamber of Commerce for additional clerical or office expense resulting from increased promotional efforts. funds shall not be used to replace the current level of Chamber expenditures for such activity.
 - d. Subsidy of a Fine Arts Center or other similar activity which could logically be expected to promote tourism.
 - e. The promotion of special events which would bring tourists to the county.

The above listing is meant to be suggestive of possible users of the funds. Other uses may come to mind after the committee is formed, and should be permitted if they would promote tourism in the county.

This agreement may be changed at any time with the mutual agreement between the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and the Hendersonville City Council.
