MINUTES

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF HENDERSON

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS November 7, 1994

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room of the Henderson County Office Building.

Those present were: Vice-Chair Renee Kumor, Commissioner J. Michael Edney, Commissioner Hugh D. Randall, Commissioner William McKay, County Manager David F. Thompson, County Attorney Don H. Elkins, Staff Attorney Angela M. Skerrett, and Clerk to the Board Elizabeth W. Corn.

Absent: Chairman Vollie G. Good and Assistant County Manager David E. Nicholson, both due to deaths in their families.

Also present were: Finance Director Carey McLelland and Planners Karen Collins and Stuart Rohrbaugh.

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Vice-Chair Kumor called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Randall led the Pledge to the American Flag.

INVOCATION

Bob Dutton, Discipleship Training Director of Carolina Baptist Association, gave the invocation.

DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF AGENDA

Commissioner Edney requested the addition of one item, Temporary Hiring Freeze of all Permanent County Employees. This was put under Discussion Items as "A-1".

David Thompson requested that item "I" be pulled from the agenda. Mr. Nicholson had prepared this item and was not present to present it. It will be on a future agenda.

CONSENT AGENDA

Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve the consent agenda as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Consent Agenda consisted of:

Review of Minutes - Minutes were presented for review and approval of the following meetings:

September 12, 1994, special called meeting September 21, 1994, regular meeting October 3, 1994, regular meeting

Streets tabled from previous meetings and Property Addressing Report - This was presented for the Board's information only. No action was required.

Fire Hydrant Easement to the City of Hendersonville - Construction of the new Courthouse necessitated the relocation of a fire hydrant to the corner of First Avenue and Pine Street. The City of Hendersonville required that an easement be granted to the City for access to hydrants so that they can be maintained and repaired.

The North Carolina General Statutes authorize the County pursuant to NCGS 153A-176, 160A-274 to convey an easement to another unit of local government for little or no consideration.

Tax Refunds - A list of tax refund requests (32) was presented by the County Tax Assessor for the Board's review and approval. Documentation is on file in the Assessor's office.

Tax Releases - A list of tax release requests (55) was presented by the County Tax Assessor for the Board's review and approval. Documentation is on file in the Assessor's office.

Resolution/Meals on Wheels Day - We have received a request for the Board to approve a Resolution proclaiming Friday, December 2, 1994 as Meals on Wheels Day.

Request for Subdivision Improvement Guarantees - Kenmure, Phase IV, Portion 6-B - John Bissetta of the Lotus-Kenmure Ltd. Partnership submitted an application for approval of an improvement guarantee for road paving for Phase IV, Portion 6-B of Kenmure. The Lotus-Kenmure Ltd. Partnership intends to deposit cash or a certified check with Henderson County in the amount of \$32,023.75 which includes a 25% overhead.

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Proclamation - We have received a request from the American Diabetes Association for the Board to proclaim the month of November as NATIONAL DIABETES MONTH.

Notification of Vacancies - The Board was notified of the following vacancies which will appear as Nominations for the next meeting:

- 1. Hendersonville City Zoning Board of Adjustment 1 vac.
- 2. Private Industry Council (PIC) 1 vacancy

INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENTS

<u>Dutch Burdette</u> - Mr. Burdette questioned whether the City had been billed for and paid the County for the sewer line in the Brooklyn Manor area. The City has recently acquired this section due to annexation.

He questioned how the City could charge for service on something they do not yet own. He questioned whether the County would be compensated for lost revenue.

PUBLIC HEARING - Public & Private Road Names

Commissioner Edney made the motion for the Board to go into Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

A, Non-Conflicting Private Streets - New Names These street names result from petitions signed by property owners stating that they want to name their private street. Staff has reviewed the street name for duplication/and or multiple identity. Staff has posted the road and placed notice of the hearing in the local newspaper.

Staff requested that three road names in this section be pulled and not acted upon today:

Byers Drive, Jasper Lane, and Sitton Road.

PUBLIC INPUT - There was none.

B, Non-Conflicting Private streets - Existing Names These street names have been documented from one or more of the following sources: United States Postal Service, Land Records Maps, Southern Bell Master Street Address Guide, Champion Map, Existing Street Name Sign, or Local Reference. Staff has reviewed the street name for duplication/and or multiple identity. Staff has posted the road and placed notice of the hearing in the local newspaper.

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<u>PUBLIC INPUT</u> - Howard Berghegger - Mr. Berghegger spoke regarding Fernwood Drive. He did not object to the name of the road but rather spoke regarding the placement of the road sign, stating that two are needed and where they need to be placed.

Staff requested that one road name in this section be pulled and not acted upon today:

Malvern Drive.

E, Conflicting State Roads These street names may result from petitions received by property owners stating that they want to rename their street due to a name duplication or multiple identity. Staff has reviewed the petitions to document that a majority of property owners (51%) support the proposed name.

The street names may also result from the planning staff posting one street name for a street that has multiple names. The decision of one street name over another is derived from the street name being documented from more than one of the following sources: United States Postal Service, Land Records Maps, Southern Bell Master Street Address Guide, Champion Map, or Existing Street Name Sign. Staff has posted the road and placed notice of the hearing in the local newspaper.

Public Input - There was none.

Commissioner Edney made the motion for the Board to go out of Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve road names in section "A" with the exception of the three names pulled. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Section "A" approved names:

Adger Drive, Banning Lane, Berry Patch Drive, Camp Kanuga Circle, Carousel Corner Drive, Christina Heather Drive, Country Wood Way, Durham Drive, Earl Culbreth Drive, Elwood Drive, Evans Cove, Gillespie Lane, Happy Valley Drive, Justice Ridge Drive, Laurel Acres Lane, Morgan Paige Drive, Old Barn Road, Peace Drive, Pryor Drive, Rocky Top Road, Ronald Lively Road, Sargeant Lane, Stepp Ponderosa Trail, Tarheel Lane.

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Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve road names in Section "B" with the exception of one road name pulled - Malvern Drive. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Section "B" approved names:

Cameron Drive, Cherrywood Lane, Deerpath Drive, Fernwood Drive, Foothills Drive, Holly Drive, Holly Street, Hunters Ridge, Lakemoor Lane, Ristau Lane, Woodchuck Way.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve road names in Section "E" as follows: Fairway Drive West (SR 2029), Half Circle Lane (SR 1532), L.R. Smith Avenue (SR 1531), and Ripley Avenue (SR 1374). All voted in favor and the motion carried.

TEMPORARY HIRING FREEZE

Commissioner Edney read a prepared statement as follows:

Temporary Hiring Freeze

"There are several issues currently facing the County Commissioners which may have a direct impact on the level of staffing and number of employees we have in County Government. These issues include the City of Hendersonville's annexation of areas within the County, the ongoing talks relating to the possible consolidation of services with the various municipalities, and the possible transitions required as a result of tomorrows elections.

The County Commissioners have an obligation to the citizens of Henderson County to staff our various departments only to the level necessary to provide the services of that department. As the effects of annexation and possible consolidation take hold, County government must be prepared to address the issue of what is the appropriate level of staffing necessary.

The County Commissioners also have an obligation to the citizens of Henderson County to insure that whatever transitions are necessary after the election tomorrow are made with the least disruption to county services as possible.

One of the steps that we can take as a Board is to temporarily freeze the hiring, reclassification or promotion of permanent County employees in each and every department of county government. The Board would look to the County Manager to provide the Board with requests to hire, reclassify or promote prior to advertising for candidates. No positions vacated would be filled unless they were first approved by the Board of Commissioners except those already advertised.

The County Manager and I both feel that this temporary freeze is necessary for the following reasons:

- 1. Upon changes in the elected officials' offices, it will provide a process to look at staffing needs and provide for the officials' flexibility in staffing their office while still being sure that it is an orderly transition for anyone leaving or coming on board as a county employee. Keep in mind that the elected officials will have a full month to prepare to take office. Hopefully, they will utilize this time to become familiar with County personnel policies, State and Federal Laws, such as, the American With Disabilities Act, and Fair Labor Standards Act. I would like to urge newly elected officials, whether they be a Sheriff, Register of Deeds, or County Commissioner to consult with County Staff about the changes which have occurred in the last few years with the Commissioner/Manager form of government. This month should be utilized to make the transition as smooth as possible with a minimum impact on County employees and the public they serve.
- 2. The hiring of County Staff requires orientations, setting up personnel files, signing them up for various benefits such as insurance, 401-K plans, retirements, etc. It is a time consuming process and needs to be planned for by administrative staff and the finance department. Hopefully through transition planning this can be done in an orderly manner avoiding errors.
- 3. Employees that are leaving will require a large amount of administrative support also. Issues such as the continuation of insurance, processing of retirement papers, paying out for vacation, filing for unemployment, accounting for equipment that was issued to them or their office are examples.
- 4. Each position request must be studied in light of the consequences of annexation. Burdened by the loss of revenue which has accompanied annexation, the County Commissioners and Staff must review the level of service offered by each department and then determine the level of staffing necessary to provide that level of service.
- 5. Each position request must be studied in light of the ongoing talks of consolidation of services with the various municipalities. For example, the Manager is meeting tomorrow with the private consolidation study group and the municipal managers. Consolidation issues are ultimately policy issues which can only be addressed by the Commissioners. During this time it is essential that Commissioners be involved so as to provide management with a road map in this are.

This temporary freeze is an effort to stabilize County government through this transition period and to provide guidance to management. It will insure the County Commissioners retain control of the pay and classification system of County government. It is not meant to interfere with the right of newly elected officials to select their own staff. It is a tool to facilitate a smooth transition with minimum liability to Henderson County. This freeze would be in effect until County Commissioners are assured that the transition is complete and Staff has had sufficient guidance from the Commissioners as it relates to levels of service. In this regard, I would request that the County Manager keep the Board posted on these various processes as they proceed."

Commissioner Edney made the motion that effective immediately the County Commissioners put in place a Temporary Freeze in hiring,

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reclassification, or promotion of all permanent County employees in each and every department of County government.

There was much discussion. It was the consensus of the Board that this would be a temporary situation, only to help through a transition period.

David Thompson stressed that the Board of Commissioners can lift the freeze when they feel things have stabilized.

A vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING FOR CHAMPION HILLS, Section 3 (Application for a PUD)

Stuart Rohrbaugh informed the Commissioners of a request to schedule a Public Hearing for Champion Hills, Section 3, an application for a planned unit development (PUD). The Planning Board had a special called meeting on November 1 and was scheduled to act on the request but due to the lack of a quorum, rescheduled their meeting for November 9. The PUD is for a 42 unit development in an R-20 zoning district adjacent to Indian Cave Road.

Planning Staff had no objection to setting a public hearing prior to formal Planning Board action. The earliest date that an evening public hearing could be scheduled and meet statutory public notice requirements would be December 5, 1994.

Following much discussion, Commissioner McKay made the motion to set the Public Hearing as recommended, for December 5 at 7:00 p.m. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

REZONING REQUEST - Esther Ferrell

Karen Collins informed the Commissioners of an application submitted by Esther Ferrell which requests that the County rezone a 0.4 acre parcel located on Greenville Highway (US 25 South) from R-T (Residential Transient) to C-1 (Residential Commercial). The Board of Commissioners must hold a public hearing on this application prior to taking action. The earliest possible date on which the Board could hold such a hearing would be Monday, December 5, 1994.

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The Planning Board voted 5-3 on October 25, 1994, to send this application to the Board of Commissioners with a favorable recommendation.

Following discussion, Commissioner McKay made the motion to set the Public Hearing for December 5 at 7:00 p.m., or immediately following the Public Hearing on Champion Hills. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

REQUEST FOR PUBLIC HEARING FOR PUBLIC & PRIVATE ROAD NAMES

The Planning Department had made a request to set a public hearing for naming of public and private road names for December 5, 1994.

David Thompson reminded the Board that the December 5 meeting will be the annual organizational meeting; therefore, it might be better to hold this particular hearing on February 6, 1995.

Commissioner Edney made the motion to set this public hearing for February 6, 1995 at 7:00 p.m. (not to exceed 100 names). All voted in favor and the motion carried.

APPEAL FROM DECISION OF PLANNING BOARD BY STEPHEN D. KAYLOR regarding ORCHARD VALLEY SUBDIVISION

Stephen D. Kaylor, representing Michael and Elaine Kreckovsky, developers of Orchard Valley, Section One, has appealed the decision of the Planning Board on October 24,1994 to deny an extension for the development. The Land Development Ordinance requires all appeals for such decisions be taken to the Board of Commissioners.

Matt Matteson reminded the Board that this began in 1991 with the initial application being submitted to the Planning Department for the Master Plan and Preliminary Plan, Phase I, of Orchard Valley.

Following much discussion and an opinion from the County Attorney, Commissioner Edney made the motion to reverse the Planning Board's decision and approve a six month extension. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

REQUEST FOR SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENT GUARANTEES - Carriage Park Development Corporation

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Stuart Rohrbaugh informed the Board of an application received from Carriage Park Development Corporation for approval of an improvement guarantee for road, drainage, water and sewer improvements for Section 25 of Carriage Falls, a development parcel of the Planned Unit Development. This Section has been previously approved by the Henderson County Planning Board on June 28, 1994.

Carriage Park Development Corporation intends to provide an Irrevocable Letter of Credit in the amount of \$186,715.50 which includes a 25% overhead factor. Modifications discussed by Henderson County Board of Commissioners and the Planning Staff at the October 19, 1994 meeting were included in the draft agreement.

In addition, the Board inquired about a waiver of jurisdiction for the sewer improvements. The waiver was approved for Section 25 at the June 6, 1994 meeting of the Mud Creek Water and Sewer District.

David Thompson reminded the Board that the Board of Commissioners delayed approval of this improvement guarantee after considerable discussion about the sewer waiver discussed above. This portion of the Planned Unit Development has already been approved and the question before the Board was whether the improvement guarantees for this project were sufficient or not.

Following discussion, Commissioner Edney made the motion to approve the application for approval of improvement guarantee for Section 25 of Carriage Falls. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

RECESS - Vice-Chair Kumor called a 10 minute recess.

REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENT GUARANTEES - Champion Hills, Section 9 (revised)

Karen Collins reminded the Board that on April 4, 1994, the Board of Commissioners approved a request by the Branigar Organization to post an Irrevocable Letter of Credit in the amount of \$233,295.00 to guarantee the construction of road, drainage, water and sewer improvements in Section 9 (revised) of Champion Hills. On August 17, 1994, the Board approved a request for an extension of the completion date, originally set for August 1, 1994 until October 31, 1994.

John Jeter of W. Lapsley and Associates, project engineers, has submitted another request to extend the completion date so that

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they can construct a water booster pump station. A new completion date of January 31, 1995, was recommended. The letter of credit would need to be extended as well, to March 31, 1995.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve the request as recommended. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

DISTRIBUTION OF SCHEDULE OF VALUES

Robert Baird presented the Schedule of Values to the Board of Commissioners. There was discussion of a calendar of events as follows:

November 7, 1994 7:00 p.m.	Regular meeting; formal presentation of the proposed Schedule of Values.
December 6, 1994 1:00 p.m.	Special meeting; discussion of the proposed Schedule of Values and Reappraisal work session.
December 6, 1994 7:00 p.m.	Special meeting; Public Hearing on the proposed Schedule of Values.
December 21, 1994 9:00 a.m.	Regular meeting; Adoption of the Schedule of Values.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve the above Calendar or Schedule for the proposed Schedule of Values. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR COURTHOUSE SITE IMPROVEMENTS

Angela Skerrett informed the Board that Courthouse construction has reached a stage in which it is now appropriate to install the site improvements. The site improvements include landscaping, irrigation, and site furnishings for the Courthouse. The Architect's estimate for these improvements is \$120,000.00.

On October 18, 1994, the County received sealed bids for site improvements on the new Courthouse. However, only one bid was received. Under the North Carolina General Statutes for a construction project exceeding \$100,000.00 in cost, a minimum of

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three bids must be received before bids may be opened. Therefore, the one bid received was returned unopened to the bidder.

The site improvements were re-bid. A copy of the Invitation to Re-bid was reviewed. On Friday, November 4, 1994, new bids were received.

Ms. Skerrett informed the Board that the architect recommended submitting this as a change order to M.B. Kahn and ask them to come back with a price to the county of what they could do this for. The architect is in the process of negotiating this with M.B. Kahn.

No action was necessary at this time. David Thompson stated that this will hopefully be ready to present to the Board at the November 16 meeting.

RESOLUTION - Land Of Sky Regional Council

David Thompson informed the Board of a request from Land Of Sky Regional Council for the Board of Commissioners to authorize the release of funds to Land Of Sky in the amount of \$13,045.05 (Henderson County's portion of \$48,015.) This is a yearly procedure to release the funds that the general assembly appropriated to Land Of Sky.

Following discussion, Commissioner McKay made the motion to adopt the resolution. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

CODIFICATION OF COUNTY ORDINANCES

Angela Skerrett reminded the Board that on August 17, 1994, she presented the Board with three proposals for the codification of the county ordinances.

Codification is the process by which all the County laws (ordinances, resolutions, and policies of a general and permanent nature) are organized and cross referenced into a one volume book called a code. The total process from start to finish would take approximately 24 months at a minimum.

In August the Board authorized Ms. Skerrett to negotiate with General Code Publishers because the Board liked their format as well as items offered by General Code Publishers in the proposal.

The basic cost for the County's code will be \$7,800.00. This includes an on-site research of the County's records, three conferences with representatives from General Code, cross-referencing and indexing of the Code, publication of the Code containing up to 325 pages, and 40 copies of the Code. For any additional pages over 325, the additional cost will be \$18.00 per page. General Code will also offer supplementation services to the County at their then prevailing rates upon completion of the Code. The County will also be able to order additional copies of the code, as well as pamphlets containing the individual chapters of the code. The proposal also indicates that computerized versions of the Code, as well as a computerized version that can be searched, are available as options. Staff is not recommending that the County order the computerized options at this time.

Upon award of the Contract, General Code will begin its on-site research. This will be completed within 60 days of the date of the Contract. Within 240 days of the Contract date, General Code will compile a draft manuscript of the Code and present a Report of Comments and Recommendations concerning revisions to the Code. this point, the Board will need to conduct work sessions to per County's ordinances as the update the evaluate and recommendations of General Code. Other revisions to existing County ordinances desired by the Board can also be made at this estimates that the work sessions will Staff approximately six months to complete. Upon completion of the work sessions by the County, the staff will meet with representatives to convey the changes to be made to the draft. Within 30 days of this meeting, General Code will present a report on this meeting which will indicate the last-minute information or changes needed or recommended by General Code. The final volumes of the Code will be delivered within 120 days of the date at which the County provides all last-minute information needed by General Code for the final publication.

Staff recommended approval of this proposal from General Code, and authorization for the County Manager to execute the document. \$12,000.00 was put in Governing Body's budget to cover this project.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to authorize the County Manager to execute the contract. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

RESOLUTION - Land Records Grant

David Thompson stated that this is a standard grant that we apply for yearly. Grant application and resolution were reviewed requesting funding under the North Carolina Land Records Management Program. Henderson County receives funding under this program each year to assist with the automation of our Land Records Department. Robert Baird, County Assessor, requested a grant of \$30,000.00. However, the Department of the Secretary of State has already indicated that we will only receive \$5,000.00 again this year.

Commissioner Edney made the motion to adopt the Resolution as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

OFFER TO PURCHASE/FORECLOSED PROPERTY

Don Elkins informed the Board of an Offer To Purchase (for \$375) received from Cecil W. Patterson for property described as follows:

PIN# 99-379-31 Lot# 147 Highland Lake Club Lots owner prior to foreclosure - J.W. Denney

The county has owned this property since 1948. It has a tax value of \$4,200. Mr. Elkins informed the Board they could either reject the offer or approve it on the basis of acceptance subject to being advertised for upset bids.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve the acceptance subject to being advertised for upset bids. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

NOMINATIONS

Vice-Chair Kumor reminded the Board of the following vacancies and opened the floor for nominations:

- 1. Nursing Home/Domiciliary Home Advisory Committee 1 vacancy. There were no nominations at this time so the item was rolled to the next meeting.
- 2. Private Industry Council (PIC) ~ 2 vacancies. Ray Cantrell recommended Mr. Stan Shelley to fill this vacancy by telephone. The Clerk has mailed Mr. Shelley an application to fill out.

Commissioner Edney nominated Stan Shelley. Commissioner McKay made the motion to suspend the rules and appoint Mr. Shelley to fill one of these two vacancies. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

3. Henderson County Planning Board - 1 vacancy. Nominations from the October 3 meeting were Charles (Chuck) McGrady and E. Cater Leland, Jr. An additional application has been received since that date. At the October 16 meeting it was stated that additional nominations may be made at the November 7 meeting.

Commissioner McKay nominated Carolyn M. Johnson.

Commissioner Edney made the motion to suspend the rules and vote on these nominees. All voted in favor and the motion carried. The Clerk polled the Board for votes, Carolyn Johnson got three out of four votes. Mrs. Carolyn M. Johnson is the new appointment to the Henderson County Planning Board.

IMPORTANT DATES

David Thompson reminded the Board of the need to schedule a work session on Carriage Park. His suggestion was to change the EMS Work Session scheduled for November 14 at 7:00 p.m. to a work session on Carriage Park. His recommendation was to reschedule the EMS work session for a later date.

David Thompson also recommended setting a work session on Wastewater Issues for November 21, 7:00 - 10:00 p.m.

There were reminders of some other dates.

CLOSED SESSION

Commissioner Edney made the motion for the Board to go into Closed Session as allowed under NC General Statutes:

- 1. NC GS 143-318.11 (a) (4) to discuss matters relating to the location or expansion of industries or other businesses in the area served by the public body
- 2. NC GS 143-318.11 (a)(3) to consult with the county attorney in order to preserve the attorney-client privilege between the attorney and the public body.

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All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Edney made the motion for the Board to go out of Closed Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:55 a.m.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, in North Carolina the Lead Regional Organizations, as voluntary organizations serving municipal and county governments, have established productive working relationships with the cities and counties across the state;

WHEREAS, the 1994 General Assembly recognized this need through the appropriation of \$864,270 to help the Lead Regional Organizations assist local governments with grant applications, economic development, community development, and to support local industrial development activities and the activities as deemed appropriate by their local governments; and

WHEREAS, these funds are not intended to be used for payment of member dues or assessments to a Lead Regional Organization or to supplant funds appropriated by the member governments;

WHEREAS, in the event that a request is not made by Henderson County for release of these funds to our Regional Council, the available funds will revert to State's general funds; and

WHEREAS, in Region B, funds in the amount of \$48,015 will be used for grant assistance, infrastructure assistance, economic development, planning assistance, economic development training, labor force development, maintenance and distribution of socio-economic data and projections, and other programs to help develop the region in an orderly manner.
