# STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF HENDERSON

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FEBRUARY 3, 1992

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Henderson County Office Building.

Those present were: Chairman J. Michael Edney, Vice-Chairman Vollie G. Good, Commissioner F. Richard Baker, Commissioner Hugh D. Randall, Commissioner William McKay, County Manager David F. Thompson, Assistant County Manager/Finance Director David E. Nicholson, County Attorney Don H. Elkins, and Clerk to the Board Elizabeth W. Corn.

## CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Edney called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

## PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Randall led the pledge to the American Flag.

#### INVOCATION

Rev. Jimmy Cox of Naples Baptist Church gave the invocation.

### REVIEW OF MINUTES

Minutes of the January 6 and the January 22 meetings were presented for review. Minutes were approved as corrected.

## DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF AGENDA

David Thompson added item "M" under New Business, Chairman/County Manager Informal Update Sessions.

Chairman Edney moved item "3" Agriculture Advisory Board (under Nominations) until after Executive Session.

### <u>PUBLIC HEARING - Naming or renaming and numbering of roads</u>

Susan D. Sneed, E-9-1-1 System Coordinator, addressed the Board regarding this public hearing. Proper notice has been given and these roads have been posted. A list was presented of 50 roads for the Board's approval. This is the second public hearing on naming or renaming and numbering of roads.

Susan Sneed asked that three roads be pulled and action postponed until a later date because of conflict of interest:

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- 1. Cedar Creek Drive
- 2. Connelly Road (SR #1423)
- 3. Cozy Acres Lane

Mrs. Sneed had one other change; Dolger Drive was a misspelling and should be Doelger Drive.

Commissioner Good made the motion to go into Public Hearing to hear public input on the naming or renaming of the 50 road names presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### PUBLIC INPUT

- 1. Bill Edgar Mr. Edgar lives at 518 Walton Drive (a private road) and questioned whether the county had any intentions of changing the name of his road. The road is listed as Walton Drive and that name would be readopted if the Board so chooses tonight.
- 2. Orletta Boyle Ms. Boyle spoke regarding Cold Spring Road (formerly known as Boyle Road). She does not want the name changed to Cold Spring Road.

Mrs. Sneed stated that she received a Road Petition July 12, 1991, requesting that this road be named either Cold Spring Road (1st choice) or Adventure Trail (2nd choice). Eighteen (18) petitioners signed of Twenty-two (22) residents. Some residents did not sign. They are land owners but do not have homes on the land. Mrs. Sneed also broke the road down into road frontage, 74% of the road frontage and 82% of the residents signed wanting the name Cold Spring Road.

Mrs. Boyle stated that this has been her road for 40 years, there was no road, she had the one lane road built and keeps it up.

Mrs. Boyle has a description of the road in Book #27, page 525 in the Courthouse. It states that Mr. Corn left the right-of-way for his heirs and assigns. She said that she is an assign.

- 3. Mrs. Lowell Corn Mrs. Corn said that her husband started the petition requesting the name change due to the fact that this road is approximately 3 miles East of Hendersonville on Hwy. #64 and Broyles Road is approximately 3 miles West on Hwy. #64.
- 4. W.F. Thompson Mr. Wallace Thompson lives on Thompson Road and states that the road name sign is down. He questioned whether any of the Commissioners requested that the sign be taken down.

No Commissioner requested that the sign be removed.

Mr. Thompson is the brother of Oletta Boyle and spoke briefly regarding Boyle Road. Mr. Thompson stated that if the county is

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going to put a road name sign up they should also maintain the road sign.

- 5. Tim Brooks Mr. Brooks lives on Joanne Lane. This road appears on the list as Joanne's Lane. He prefers the name Joanne Lane as it has been known for the past 10 years.
- <u>6. Susan Lyda Mrs. Lyda lives on Connelly Road which was removed from the list tonight and action postponed.</u> She would prefer to speak at the time Connelly Road is considered.
- 7. Gordon Corn Mr. Corn is Lowell Corn's father. Mr. Corn spoke regarding Boyle Road stating that his property line goes to the center of the road. Lowell Corn's property also goes to the center of the road. His daughter's property line also goes to the center of the road. He stated that the road has been there for 63 years and is not Mrs. Boyle's road.
- 8. Orletta Boyle Mrs. Boyle said that there was no road when she bought the property and she made it. She referred again to the book and page # stating that the road was left to the heirs and the assigns. She is an assign and she made the road.

Commissioner Randall made the motion to close the Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

There was discussion of the roads. Mr. Brooks was asked if he would petition the other property owners to see whether they prefer Joanne Lane or Joanne's Lane.

Commissioner Good made the motion to correct the spelling on Joanne's Lane to Joanne Lane.

There was discussion on the motion and Mr. Brooks stated that he would take a petition for his neighbors' signatures. Commissioner Good withdrew his motion.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to carry Joanne Lane over until the next meeting. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to carry Cold Spring Road over until the next meeting so staff could review. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Randall made the motion to re-adopt the list of road names minus the two voted on above and the three that staff recommended be postponed. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

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## PUBLIC INPUT

No one signed up to speak.

Chairman Edney decided to skip over nominations at this time and handle the school merger item because of the number of people in attendance for that item.

# HENDERSONVILLE CITY AND HENDERSON COUNTY SCHOOLS PROPOSED MERGER PLAN

David Thompson informed the Board that Hendersonville City and Henderson County School boards together held a public hearing on Wednesday, January 29, 1992 at 7:30 p.m. at Blue Ridge Community College to gain input to the proposed merger plan that has been discussed previously. On Friday, January 31, 1992, a joint committee comprised of membership from both boards met to make any changes the boards considered prudent as a result of the public hearing. Later that same afternoon the full boards of both systems met and approved the merger plan.

The goal is to have the approved plan to the State Board of Education by the 10th of February so that it will be acted upon at the March 4-5 meeting of the State Board.

Mr. Thompson presented the legal requirements for merger as per the General Statutes. He called the Board's attention to the section concerning the required certifications that must be submitted to them along with the plan for the Board's concurrence and approval.

The Board was given the executed plan and a certification of adoption of the plan of merger. The funding figure was discussed. Mr. Thompson informed the Board of a letter from both Superintendents showing justification for the minimum funding figure of \$800.

Chairman Edney stated that his understanding of the issue is that the initial year of the merged plan would require a funding level of between \$800-850 per student. Mr. Thompson agreed with his interpretation. Chairman Edney asked if anyone had a different interpretation, no one spoke. Chairman Edney stated that the justification for the funding appears to be basically the replacement of the school district tax plus the cost of inflation for two years.

Chairman Edney recognized Frank Ewbank, Chairman of the Hendersonville City Board of Education. Mr. Ewbank has been ill and Chairman Edney thanked him for being here tonight.

Mr. Ewbank strongly urged the approval of the County Commissioners of the merger plan tonight.

<u>Comment - Commissioner Baker stated that he is disappointed to see the funding figure remain in the final merger plan; however, he will not vote against it because of that. He has repeatedly asked for justification of the figure and has received nothing until this meeting.</u>

Commissioner Good made the motion to approve the Resolution supporting and approving the Merger Plan. A vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Edney thanked everyone for all their hard work on this merger plan, City and County and Board of Commissioners and staff. He called a short recess so the documents could be signed and sent on their way to Raleigh.

#### **NOMINATIONS**

- 1. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 2 vacancies on the Jobs Training Partnership Act Committee (PIC). There were no nominations so the item was rolled.
- 2. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 1 vacancy on the Henderson County Industrial Facilities & Pollution Control Authority. There were no nominations so the item was rolled.
- 3. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 5 vacancies on the Agriculture Advisory Board.

This item was rolled until after Executive Session.

- 4. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of vacancies on the Land Use Plan Steering Committee.
- Mr. Thompson called the Board's attention to a list of 136 names, candidates that the Board discussed in Executive Session. As required by N.C. Open Meetings Law, the list was posted in the Clerk's office on the following day. Staff contacted people to see if they were willing to serve on the committee. On the memorandum dated January 27 is a listing of all the people contacted and all have agreed to serve. Mr. Carpenter agreed to serve as Chairman and Evelyn Barker agreed to serve as Vice-Chairman. One membership position, Fletcher Planning Board member, is not included on the list because the Fletcher Planning Board members had not been reappointed at this time.

Commissioner McKay nominated Walter Carpenter to serve as Chairman.

Commissioner Good nominated Boyce Orr from The Hendersonville Planning Board.

Chairman Edney nominated Don Pletcher from Laurel Park Planning Board.

Commissioner McKay nominated Evelyn Barker from Real Estate and Building, to serve as Vice-Chairman.

Chairman Edney nominated Bill Altman, an Industrial representative and Steve Waggoner, a Surveyor.

Commissioner Randall nominated Danny McConnell from the Agriculture area.

Commissioner McKay nominated Carolyn Johnson from the Agriculture area and Fred Pittillo.

Commissioner Good nominated Jay Angel from the Building and Real Estate area.

Chairman Edney nominated Robert Beale, a local banker and Bette Carter, a retail business lady.

Commissioner Good nominated Dick Shuffstall of Mills River as an environmental representative, as well as Bill Read of Laurel Park and Ken Weitzen from Green River.

Commissioner Randall nominated Frank Todd, Jr. from the Etowah area.

Commissioner McKay nominated Charlotte Buller and Dutch Burdette, community service representatives.

Chairman Edney nominated Mac Brackett, Fred Niehoff, and Polly Kremer.

There were no other nominations at this time. There may be areas not represented that may be added at a later time.

Commissioner Good made the motion to appoint all 21 of these nominees to the Land Use Plan Steering Committee Board, Mr. Carpenter to serve as Chairman and Mrs. Barker as Vice-Chairman. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Chairman Edney stated that the Board of E & R is listed for information only, the appointments need to be made at the March 2 meeting.

# RECOMMENDED USE OF ADDITIONAL STATE CHILD PROTECTION FUNDS

As per earlier instructions, Liston Smith came before the Board today to make recommendations to utilize remaining child protection funds. The funds are 100% State; each county received an allocation based on formula and any unused funds will revert back to the State to be redistributed to other counties. In addition to the Board's approval, these recommendations are contingent on State Office approval.

Mr. Smith recommends the funds be used for:

- 1. Training for Child Protective Services Workers
- 2. On-Call payment
- 3. Payment for Active Parenting Discussion Program
- 4. Child Mental Health Evaluations
- 5. Camcorder for Use in documentation in CPS cases
- 6. Dictaphone and tapes for use in CPS cases

Total funds needed for above: \$8,360.00

Commissioner Randall made the motion to approve the recommended use of Additional State Child Protection Funds as outlined and as recommended by Mr. Smith and his staff. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

# DISCUSSION OF EAST HENDERSON'S ORCHESTRA PARTICIPATION IN "MUSICAL SALUTE TO THE DISCOVERY OF AMERICA"

Paula Rummage addressed the Board and informed them that the East Henderson Orchestra will travel to Washington, D.C. during spring break to participate in this four month festival. There are four celebrations throughout the world that will be happening from March through July; Spain, The Bahamas, and Washington, D.C.

East Henderson has the distinction of being the only high school orchestra invited to represent North Carolina. They were selected based on their superior performance ratings received at State Competitions. They will travel by motorcoach and perform three times in Washington, as well as participate in the official wreath ceremony at The Tomb of The Unknown Soldier. Their performances will be at the Lincoln Memorial, U.S. Soldiers' and Airmen's Home, and Union Station at Pershing Park. The Official Performance will be the Pershing Park performance. The total cost per student and per chaperon is \$450.00 each. Each student and chaperon has been requested to pay \$250 of the \$450 cost. The cost covers their transportation, lodging, and two meals a day. The Orchestra is currently scheduling local concerts for financial contributions until May, 1992.

Mrs. Rummage came today to request a contribution from the County through the Board of Commissioners to assist the group in making the trip. Numerous fundraising efforts have been held. To date approximately 75% of the \$16,000 has been raised toward the trip. Total funds are due mid February in Washington, D.C.

There was discussion. Mrs. Rummage was asked if the Henderson County Board of Education had contributed. She stated that they have a written proposal before them but have not addressed it yet. She plans to go to their Board meeting as she leaves this one.

It was the consensus of the Board that the money be donated from local funds that the Board of Commissioners appropriated to the County School System. The Board is in favor of this request but felt the money should come from the School Board's budget.

#### TAX COLLECTOR'S REPORT

Terry Lyda, Henderson County Tax Collector, presented the Tax Collector's Report through January 31, 1992. The percentage collected through January, 1992 was 89.307%.

Mr. Lyda recommended to the Board of Commissioners that unpaid Tax Liens be advertised twice: on May 8, 1992 and on May 22, 1992. This is the same advertising schedule that was used last year.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to accept the tax collector's report and approve his recommendation for advertising tax liens. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### MAINSTAY GRANT PREAPPLICATION

Salley Stepp, the Executive Director of Mainstay requested the Board's support for a grant preapplication to the Governor's Crime Commission for Victim Assistance monies. The Board of Commissioners have supported similar applications for Mainstay in the past. The local match for this grant is provided by private contributions and donations given to Mainstay. This is a grant of \$32,222, Mainstay will provide \$8,056 toward the grant using contribution and donation funds. There are no county funds involved with this grant. A project summary was presented.

The first place a battered woman/man will go for help is usually the Police Dept., Sheriff's Dept., Magistrate's Office, or Emergency Room. Through this grant Mainstay would be able to go to these places to assist the victim rather than the victim having to go to Mainstay. They also would like to set up a task force. No additional staff is requested, current staff will be used.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to endorse this grant. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

# ANNUAL REPORT-Nursing Home/Domiciliary Home Advisory Committee

Michael L. Martin presented the annual report verbally and answered questions. He did not present a written report but promised to do so for the Board's review.

#### RECYCLING CENTERS PROPOSAL

Nippy Page, Solid Waste Recycling Coordinator, informed the Board of six proposals received from various recycling and waste management businesses. The Solid Waste Advisory Committee recommends the award of the contract to GDS Recycling Service of Hickory. GDS satisfied all the bid requirements. They were the lowest responsible bidder.

Commissioner Good made the motion to award the contract to GDS. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

# HENDERSON COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT-Additional Staff Positions

Tom Johnson, Director of the Health Department, requested the Board's approval for two new positions. Both are permanent, full-time positions funded entirely with State Grant funds with no matching requirements and requirement for future commitments for local funding.

- #1 Community Health Assistant or Technician who will be working closely with the high risk maternity patients.
- #2 Social Worker who will be providing maternity and/or child care coordination.

The staff and Board of Health endorse the proposal because of the unmet needs of their patients and this opportunity to provide services at no increased cost to the county.

Commissioner Randall made the motion to approve these two new positions as recommended by Mr. Johnson with the stipulation that no county funds are required. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

# UPDATE ON CABLE REVIEW COMMITTEE MEETING

Chairman Edney informed the Board that the Cable Review Committee met on Wednesday, January 29 at 5:00 to discuss the following:

1. The recent increase in MultiVision's rates. Chairman Edney stated that County's cannot regulate rates.

Multivision informed the committee that they haven't raised rates in over three years although their cost of doing business has risen almost 12% over that period.

The Committee had concerns over how the increase was presented to the customer. Multivision has listed their franchise fee as a separate line item on their billing. Some people perceive this as an additional tax.

2. The proposed MultiVision construction schedule for new cable extensions for 1992.

Chairman Edney stated that in the franchise agreement, a construction schedule is required to be compiled with the advice and consent of the Board of Commissioners. The cable company presented a list which they had compiled which suggests a construction schedule of 16.48 miles. Last years list was 50+ miles of new cable. Last year they spent \$688,000 and this year they expect to spend \$230,000-240,000.

The committee raised concern over whether the construction schedule for this year was in line with the intent expressed last year. With the help of the U.S. Census Bureau, we will take census maps and combine or overlap those with the cable line maps to give the cable company and ourselves a better idea of what parts of the county and what areas of population are being served.

Another Cable Review Committee meeting is scheduled for February 20 at which time Chairman Edney hopes an agreement can be reached as to how much expansion should be done next year. A 5 year plan was discussed also.

3. The proposed acquisition of a portion of MultiVision by CableVision.

Chairman Edney informed the Board of the proposed merger or acquisition by U.S. CableVision Systems of 20% interest in MultiVision's parent company. Under our Ordinance, any acquisition or transfer of the franchise requires the prior consent of the Henderson County Board of Commissioners. Chairman Edney feels that they understand now that the Board's consent is required and they will keep us informed as progress is made. All they have at this point is a letter of intent.

Last years construction schedule was discussed. Multivision completed all but two which were still in progress at years end, two were canceled because the property owners chose not to get cable.

# DESIGNATION OF NON-CONFLICTING STATE ROAD NAMES

Matt Matteson, presented a list of road names that do not require a public hearing but the Board has to take action to adopt the names.

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Commissioner Good made the motion to approve the list of non-conflicting state road names. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### SET PUBLIC HEARING-Public & Private Road Names

Matt Matteson informed the Board of the need to set a public hearing for the next set of road names (not to exceed 50 names). Pursuant to Section 302 of the Henderson County Property Address Ordinance, a public hearing needs to be called to name or rename both private and public roads in Henderson County.

Mr.Matteson recommended the public hearing be held March 2, 1992, at 7:00 p.m.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to set the Public Hearing for March 2, 1992, at 7:00 p.m. here. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

### TAX RELEASE REQUESTS (78)

Robert Baird, County Tax Assessor submitted a list of 78 tax release requests for the Board's approval.

Commissioner Good made the motion to approve these tax release requests as presented, if all paperwork is in order. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

## TAX REFUND REQUESTS (53)

Robert Baird, County Tax Assessor submitted a list of 53 tax refund requests for the Board's approval.

Commissioner Good made the motion to approve these tax refund requests as presented, if all paperwork is in order. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

## NOTIFICATION OF VACANCIES

Chairman Edney informed the Board of four (4) vacancies on the Nursing Home/Domiciliary Home Advisory Committee. Mrs. Carpenter's term expires in April. Ms. Brown, Ms. Drake, and Ms. Healy all have terms expiring in May 1992. All four of these ladies have been sent letters to see if they are willing to serve again, if nominated. Each one can be re-appointed for a 3 year term.

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These vacancies will be listed on the next agenda for nominations.

## CHAIRMAN/COUNTY MANAGER INFORMAL UPDATE SESSIONS

David Thompson stated that due to the volume of activity recently on a variety of county projects, the Commissioners need to be informed of these items on a regular basis. Due to the amount of activity it has been difficult for Mr. Thompson to keep the Commissioners posted on the day-to-day activities. Mr. Thompson stated that it is apparent that we do not have enough time at our regularly scheduled Board Meetings to keep the Commissioners up to date.

Mr. Thompson suggested the Board consider having an informal update on the weeks when there is no formal Commissioners' Meeting. This would be an opportunity for the Manager and the Chairman to relay what has happened during the previous week to the full Board. A breakfast meeting was suggested so that it would not interfere with normal working hours.

Mr. Thompson emphasized that this would be just an informal update when the County Commissioners could ask questions about ongoing projects. There would be no formal agenda, and he would further suggest that there be no deliberations conducted by the Board at this time. The Board would be required to follow the N.C. Open Meetings Law in announcing these meetings and they would be open to the media and the public.

There was much discussion and it was decided by consensus to try this concept. The first informal update meeting was scheduled for Monday, February 10 at 7:00 a.m. Commissioner McKay made the motion to have a regular meeting Monday, February 10 at 7:00 a.m. at the Holiday Inn Restaurant. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

## MUD CREEK WATER & SEWER DISTRICT

The Board adjourned as Henderson County Board of Commissioners and convened as Mud Creek Water & Sewer District Board.

The Board adjourned as Mud Creek Water & Sewer District Board and reconvened as Henderson County Board of Commissioners.

#### EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Good made the motion for the Board to go into executive session to discuss the acquisition of real property. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

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Commissioner McKay made the motion for the Board to go out of Executive Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
