MINUTES

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF HENDERSON

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS JANUARY 6, 1992

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met at a special time of 6:00 p.m. for a special called meeting with the two School Boards for the purpose of discussing the merger plan. The meeting was in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Henderson County Office Building.

Those present were: Chairman J. Michael Edney, Vice-Chairman Vollie G. Good, Commissioner F. Richard Baker, Commissioner Hugh D. Randall, Commissioner William McKay, County Manager David F. Thompson, Assistant County Manager/Finance Director David E. Nicholson, and Clerk to the Board Elizabeth W. Corn. Absent was County Attorney Don H. Elkins.

Chairman Edney called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance. He asked the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of both the School Boards to come forward and give an update on the merger issue.

Hardy Caldwell, Chairman of the Henderson County School Board informed the Board of Commissioners that both School Boards have approved the Merger Plan as of 5:00 p.m. today. Both Boards approved the Merger Plan unanimously.

The next steps to be taken are the holding of a public hearing by the two school boards and approval by the Board of Commissioners. The Public Hearing was discussed at some length with David Thompson reading excerpts from the General Statutes.

A date needs to be set for the Public Hearing, to be held by both School Boards. The Board of Commissioners must have certified copies of both School Board's minutes showing approval of the Merger Plan before they can approve the Merger Plan and forward it to the State Board of Education.

No date was set tonight. It was decided that the Board of Commissioners would be notified of the Public Hearing date, time, and place and the Commissioners were requested to be present at the Public Hearing.

This part of the meeting was adjourned.

7:00 p.m. Regularly Scheduled Agenda

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Edney called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

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Chairman Edney lead the pledge to the American Flag.

INVOCATION

Rev. Walter Treadway of First Alliance Church gave the invocation.

REVIEW OF MINUTES

Minutes were presented for review of the December 18, 1991 Commissioners' Meeting. Commissioner Good made the motion that the minutes stand approved as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF AGENDA

David Thompson added item "J" under New Business, Crime\$toppers Request. Background material was in the agenda packet but it was not listed.

Chairman Edney requested that items "#3 and #4" of "A" Nominations, be moved until after Executive Session.

INTRODUCTION

Chairman Edney asked Matt Matteson to introduce the three Consultants who were present that will be working with the Planning Department on the Comprehensive Land Use Plan. He introduced Gary Stewart, Ed Anzek, and Mansour Edlin, all from Woolpert Consultants.

PUBLIC HEARING- Amendment to Special Use Permit #87-2 Carriage Park Planned Unit Development (PUD)

Commissioner Baker made the motion to go into Public Hearing to hear public comments regarding the Amendment to Special Use Permit All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Jim Creekman, petitioner for the amendment, addressed the issue. Mr. Creekman presented a July 21, 1987 letter regarding turning lanes. He also presented a 1988 plat approval by N.C. Department of Transportation.

Three issues were discussed regarding the modification to the Special Use Permit:

- Authority for a subsequent developer to change the mix; thereby, giving greater flexibility.
 2. Sale of lots.
- 3. Setbacks.

PUBLIC INPUT:

<u>Paul R. Turosak - Mr. Turosak's first concern was about the open-ended number of apartments allowed on the amended permit. Secondly, he didn't think there was enough buffer zone. Thirdly, he feels that a turning lane is needed.</u>

<u>Carl Leppert - Mr. Leppert spoke regarding the need for a turning lane and requested a "hold" on the Special Use Permit.</u>

E.L. Christopher - Mr. Christopher requested the project be put on hold until turning lanes are in place.

Don Soula - Mr. Soula also felt that turning lanes are needed.

Ann Bauer - Ms. Bauer feels turning lanes are needed and more of a buffer zone is needed.

<u>Helen Palmer - Ms. Palmer is worried about the density and the buffer zones.</u>

Jean Kaufor - Ms. Kaufor felt that turning lanes are needed.

<u>Ken Erb - Mr. Erb spoke regarding the turning lanes.</u> He stated that if you are coming from the North there is a turning lane. He stated that the apartment complex is 250 feet from Long John Mountain. He stated that the setback is still unclear.

<u>Virginia Burke - Ms.</u> Burke supports the changes requested by the Special Use Permit.

Matt Matteson and the Board members discussed turning lanes. Bob Crisp of N.C. Department of Transportation stated that turning lanes are not feasible at this time.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to close the Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to approve the Amendment to Special Use Permit #87-2.

Commissioner McKay requested to be excused from voting because of his personal contact with First Citizens Bank. Commissioner Good made the motion to excuse Mr. McKay from this vote. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Randall requested to be excused from voting for the same reason. Commissioner Baker made the motion to excuse Mr. Randall from this vote. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

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A vote was taken on Mr. Baker's motion to approve the requested amendment to Special Use Permit # 87-2. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING- Public and Private Road Names</u> Naming or renaming and numbering

Commissioner Baker made the motion to go into Public Hearing to hear public comment regarding Public and Private Road Names. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

The issue of discussion was suffixes. We have a pre-approved list of suffixes which apparently needs to be expanded.

Mr. Thompson recommended that the Board of Commissioners grant either himself or the Planning Department the authority to approve suffixes. No action was taken on his recommendation

PUBLIC INPUT

George Olmsted - Mr. Olmsted spoke regarding the road he lives on which is Rebels' Lair. Rebels' Lair **Drive** has been suggested by the Planning Department but he is not in agreement with the suffix **Drive**. Rebels' Lair **Trace** was suggested and he will accept Trace if it cannot be just Revels' Lair.

<u>Martha Owen - Ms. Owen did not speak.</u>

Commissioner Good made the motion to close the Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to request staff to expand the list of suffixes once and bring it back to the Board of Commissioners for approval. Mr. McKay's motion included the amendment of the Ordinance to include Lair as a suffix. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

NOMINATIONS

- 1. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 2 vacancies on the Jobs Training Partnership Act Committee (PIC). There were no nominations so the item was rolled to the next meeting.
- 2. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 2 vacancies on the Henderson County Industrial Facilities & Pollution Control Authority. There were no nominations so the item was rolled.

Chairman Edney reminded the Board that he requested the following two be moved until after Executive Session:

- 3. Land Use Steering Committee
- 4. Solid Waste Advisory Committee (SWAC)

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5. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 1 vacancy on the Nursing Home/Domiciliary Home Advisory Committee. Katherine Adams is interested in serving again, if nominated. Commissioner Baker made the motion to reappoint Ms. Adams. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

6. David Thompson informed the Board of 5 vacancies on the Agriculture Advisory Board. He has sent letters out regarding the vacancies. This will be carried over until the Feb. 3 meeting.

ADVANCED REFUNDING FINANCING TIMETABLE

David Nicholson discussed a new financing timetable for the advance refunding of the 1983 school, technical college, and hospital bond issue.

Commissioner Baker introduced the following bond order which was read at length:

"BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF HENDERSON:

WHEREAS, the County of Henderson (the "County") has issued School Bonds, dated March 1, 1983 (the "School Bonds"), and \$3,525,000 of the School Bonds are outstanding (the "Outstanding School Bonds:); and

WHEREAS, the County has issued Technical College Bonds, dated March 1, 1983 (the "Technical College Bonds"), and \$475,000 of the Technical College Bonds are outstanding (the "Outstanding Technical College Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the County has issued Hospital Bonds, dated March 1, 1983 (the "Hospital Bonds") and \$375,000 of the Hospital Bonds are outstanding (the "Outstanding Hospital Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County deems it advisable to refund the Outstanding School Bonds, the Outstanding Technical College Bonds and the Outstanding Hospital Bonds (collectively referred to herein as the "Outstanding Bonds") pursuant to and in accordance with The Local Government Finance Act; and

WHEREAS, an application has been filed with the Secretary of the Local Government Commission of North Carolina requesting Commission approval of the Bonds hereinafter described as required by The Local Government Finance Act, and the Secretary of the Local Government Commission has notified the Board that the application has been accepted for submission to the Local Government Commission; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Henderson, as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the County has ascertained and hereby determines that it is advisable to refund the Outstanding Bonds.

Section 2. In order to raise the money required to refund the Outstanding Bonds as set forth above, in addition to any funds which may be made available for such purpose from any other source, bonds of the County are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The Local Government Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of bonds authorized by this bond order shall be \$5,000,000.

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. A sworn statement of the County's debt has been filed with the Clerk to the Board and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This bond order shall take effect upon its adoption.

Commissioner Baker moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the bond order entitled, "BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF HENDERSON," has been introduced at the meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Henderson held on January 6, 1992 and the Board of Commissioners of the County of Henderson desires to provide for the holding of a public hearing thereon and the submission of a statement of debt in connection therewith as required by The Local Government Bond Act; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Henderson, as follows:

- (1) The public hearing upon said bond order shall be held on the 22nd day of January, 1992 at 9 o'clock A.M., at the County Office Building, in Hendersonville, North Carolina.
- (2) The Clerk to the Board is hereby directed to cause a copy of the bond order to be published with a notice of such hearing in the form prescribed by law in a qualified newspaper no fewer than six days prior to such public hearing.

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(3) The County's Finance Officer is hereby directed to file with the Clerk prior to publication of the bond order with the notice of such public hearing, a statement setting forth the debt incurred or to be incurred, the appraised value of property subject to taxation by the County and the net debt of the County.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner McKay and was adopted by the following vote:

STATE CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES FUNDS FY91/92

Karen Couch informed the Board that beginning January 1, 1992, the General Assembly appropriated additional State monies for each of North Carolina's 100 counties. In FY 91/92, county departments will receive 3.25 million dollars. For FY 92/93, 7 million dollars is allocated.

Henderson County will receive \$33,838 for the six month period of January 1, 1992 through June 30, 1992. The money is specifically for expanded or enhanced child protective services and is not available to fund existing staff or services. Increased ability to investigate abuse and neglect referrals is the intent behind the General Assembly appropriation.

Currently, DSS averages 68 new investigations a month. They are providing services to 160 families where abuse or neglect has been established. An additional 276 cases are still in the assessment phase. This is a total of 436 active child protective services cases. Some of these cases can be closed following completion of paperwork and regulatory requirements. Six front line workers work with these cases with caseload responsibilities considerably above the recommended caseloads.

Karen Couch presented Liston Smith's recommendation that the county approve two child protective services positions contingent on State monies available to fund the positions 100 percent.

DSS is working toward possibly outposting these two positions in the County and City Schools to enhance coordination and services to children in the school system. Outreach should foster an

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enhanced service from school and social service personnel to abused and neglected children. The outreach approach minimizes any space problems because the positions will be working out of a local school.

After considerable discussion, Commissioner Randall made the motion that the county accept the state appropriation of \$33,838 for FY 91/92 and the Board authorize two child protective service workers including equipment and supplies not to exceed \$27,000. Any funds above \$27,000 up to the full state appropriation require Board of Commissioner approval prior to expenditure. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

PERMIT FEES FOR HANDICAPPED CONSTRUCTION

Sam Laughter, Zoning/Code Enforcement Administrator, informed the Board that over the past few years an awareness of the needs of handicapped individuals on a state level and national level has increased. To encourage the needs of the handicapped to be met, he proposed that Henderson County amend their building permit fee schedule to allow permit fees to be waived on all constructions which would enable handicap access to private as well as public buildings.

The permits would include construction of handicapped ramps and expanding toilet room areas to meet the handicapped codes. Building permits would still be required and the building code would be enforced on such structures; however, the local permit fee would be waived on approval of the Code Enforcement Administrator.

After discussion, Commissioner McKay made the motion that the local permit fee be waived for construction of handicapped ramps and expanding toilet room areas to meet the handicapped codes. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

DESIGNATION OF NON-CONFLICTING STATE ROAD NAMES

Susan Sneed submitted a list of 65 public roads that are in agreement with State Road names and numbers that the Board of Commissioners needs to re-adopt.

Mr. Thompson stated that a public hearing is not required but the Board still has to take action to adopt these road names.

Commissioner Good made the motion to approve the list of 65 names, as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

SET PUBLIC HEARING - Public & Private Road Names

Susan Sneed informed the Board that pursuant to Section 302 of the Henderson County Property Address Ordinance, a public hearing needs

to be called to name or rename both private and public roads in Henderson County. The list of roads will be determined later, not to exceed 50 names.

A notice of the hearing will be placed in the Times-News. Once the hearing has been held, the street names may be adopted with whatever changes the Board may wish to make. If another name is suggested, a new public hearing will need to be scheduled.

The earliest evening meeting this public hearing could be held was February 3, 1992 at 7:00 p.m. To meet the public notice requirements, advertisements must be placed in the newspaper and the notices need to be posted ten (10) days prior to the hearing date.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to set the Public Hearing for public and private road names for 7:00 p.m. February 3, 1992, in the County Administration Building. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

RELEASE OF STATE FUNDS TO LAND OF SKY REGIONAL COUNCIL

David Thompson submitted a resolution and authorizing legislation regarding the release of State funds to Land of Sky Regional Council. These funds (\$12,929.88 for Henderson County) are to be used by the Council of Governments only to "... assist local governments in grant applications, economic development, community development, and to support local industrial development activities and other activities as deemed appropriate by their local governments." If the Board of Commissioners does not authorize this release, the allocation will revert to the general fund of North Carolina.

Mr. Thompson recommended that the resolution be executed.

Commissioner Good made the motion to adopt the Resolution as recommended. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

OFFER TO PURCHASE/FORECLOSURE PROPERTY

We have received an offer to purchase property foreclosed in the name of Clarence A. Stepp. The property is 93/100 acre on Sugar Loaf Road, in Blue Ridge Township. Mr. Stepp's daughter has filled out an offer to purchase and left a 5% deposit.

Since family is purchasing the property, it need not be advertised.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to accept the Offer to Purchase from Mrs. Cynthia S. Jones for \$210.65 and give her a deed. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

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UNTIMELY TAX EXEMPT APPLICATION

Robert Baird submitted an untimely tax exempt application received from Greater New Zion Baptist Church on US 25 South. Under NC GS 105.282.1, untimely applications may be approved by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners. Mr. Baird informed the Board that this is parsonage property.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to approve the untimely tax exempt application. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

TAX REFUNDS

Robert Baird submitted a list of 53 tax refund requests for the Board's approval.

Commissioner Good made the motion to approve the tax refund requests if all the paperwork is in order. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

TAX RELEASES

Robert Baird submitted a list of 161 tax release requests for the Board's approval.

Commissioner Good made the motion to approve the tax release requests if all the paperwork is in order. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

CRIME\$TOPPERS REQUEST

David Thompson informed the Board of a request from Ted Willsey, President of Crime\$toppers of Henderson County. He is requesting that the county place Crime\$toppers bumper stickers on every county vehicle.

After some discussion, Commissioner McKay made the motion that the request be granted with the understanding that there will be no cost to Henderson County. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Baker made the motion for the Board to go into Executive Session as allowed under GS 143-118.11 to discuss a personnel matter and the acquisition of real property. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Good made the motion for the Board to go out of Executive Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

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Clerk to the Board left during Executive Session discussion.

BOARD OF E & R

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners convened as the Henderson County Board of Equalization & Review for the purpose of hearing two 1991 tax appeals.

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Board reconvened as the Henderson County Board of Commissioners.

During Executive Session there was discussion on the Land Use Steering Committee and possible nominees. The list of which were discussed was filed with the Clerk to the Board the following day.

SWAC appointment

There was one vacancy on the Solid Waste Advisory Committee. One interested person submitted an application.

Commissioner Good made the motion to appoint Mr. W.C. Hiatt to fill the vacancy. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
