COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING PROCESS UPDATE

PHASE 2

The comprehensive plan is a detailed plan that will take 18 months to complete. The process is broken into three phases. Phase 2 began in January and is anticipated to run through the end of summer 2022.

Phase 3 will begin in the early fall when the plan is drafted.

MARCH 2022 UPDATES

RECENT PUBLIC OUTREACH

- Staff presented information to the Hendersonville Lions Club
- Staff worked with the County's Recreation Advisory Board on drafting goals pertaining to their specialty.
- Staff conducted a stakeholder meeting with the County's Soil & Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors to ensure the comprehensive plan's agricultural goals accurately reflect the current issues of the industry
 - Information from other agriculture groups has already been collected.

STEERING COMMITTEE

- The Steering Committee received draft goals at their February meeting and sent staff comments and revisions that will be presented at their March 17th meeting.
- Stewart Consultants will attend their March 17th meeting to further their vision and goals discussion.



• Stewart Inc. will provide an update to the Board of Commissioners at one of their meetings in April.


ONGOING PUBLIC OUTREACH

- County staff are in the process of meeting with various internal boards and committees as well as active local clubs and organizations.






Thousands of written responses to this open-ended question were analyzed and assigned tags according to topics. The graph below summarizes the top tags based on that analysis.



Which of the following development types do you feel are missing from the County? (Select up to three)





Which is the single most important role for Henderson County government in the land use and zoning process, if any? (Would not apply to incorporated town, cities, or villages)





When making decisions related to land use, should the County Board of Commissioners weight the impact to the property owners closest to the proposed project more so than the overall benefit to the County as a whole?



How many years have you lived/worked in Henderson County?




