County Financial Report/Cash Balance Report – March 2018

The March 2018 County Financial Report and Cash Balance Report were provided for the Board's review and approval.

The following are explanations for departments/programs with higher budget to actual percentages for the month of March:

- Human Resources: workers compensation claims
- Garage: March fuel costs to be allocated to user departments
- Rescue Squad: vehicle repair costs and excess fuel costs

- Agri-Business: excess operating expenditures, which will be covered by membership fees
- Public Education: payment 9 of 10 of annual appropriation made to the public schools

The YTD deficits in the Edneyville Elementary School, the Hendersonville High School and the Law Enforcement Training Center (LETC) Projects are due to the payment of architect fees for these projects from appropriated fund balance in the Capital Projects Funds that will be reimbursed from future financings.

The YTD deficits in the Recreation Parks Improvements Projects and the Artificial Turf Field Projects is due to these projects being paid from appropriated fund balance in the Capital Projects Fund, primarily from proceeds received from the sale of the Bent Creek property as approved in the prior year's budget.

The YTD deficit in the Cane Creek Water & Sewer District Fund is due to sewer capital project expenditure payments on multiple projects. Fund Balance in the Cane Creek Fund was appropriated in the approved budget to cover these capital project expenditures.

Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Grants/JCPC County Plan FY 18-19

The Henderson County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has approved funding for local juvenile crime prevention programs. These funds for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 to Fiscal Year 2019-2020 in the amount of \$199,188 are available for this purpose through the State of North Carolina. Each Program is required to provide a 30% match.

2018-56 Proclamation - International Compost Awareness Week, May 6-12, 2018

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners are requested to proclaim May 6-12, 2018 as International Compost Awareness Week (ICAW). Henderson County Solid Waste has made a dedicated effort to promote backyard composting and food waste diversion options for citizens through outreach, educational workshops, expanded Convenience Center offerings, and community engagement with a variety of non-profit and private partners. Workshops are scheduled throughout the spring and summer, and staff is working with local, regional, and state partners to determine the landscape of organics production and diversion opportunities throughout the county.

International Compost Awareness Week began in 1995 and is the largest and most comprehensive education initiative of the compost industry. The goal of the program is to raise public awareness regarding the benefits of using compost to improve or maintain high quality soil, to grow healthy plants, reduce the use of fertilizer and pesticides, improve water quality and protect the environment.

Motion:

I move that the Board adopts the Proclamation designating the week of May 6-12, 2018 as International Compost Awareness Week.

Staff received petitions to add the roads to the state road system. It has been the practice of this Board to accept road petitions and forward them to NC Department of Transportation for their review. It has also been the practice of the Board not to ask NCDOT to change the priority for roads on the paving priority list.

Set Public Hearing for Rezoning Application #R-2018-02, The Cox Property, Community Commercial (CC) to Residential Two Rural (R2R)

Rezoning Application #R-2018-02, which was initiated on March 13th, 2018, requests the County rezone approximately 0.37 acres of land (thereafter the "Subject Area"). Planning Staff finds no technical restriction to the Subject Area being rezoned from a Community Commercial (CC) zoning district to a Residential Two Rural (R2R) zoning district. The Subject Area is located near the intersection of Upward Rd. and Howard Gap Rd. The owner of the Subject Area is Mr. Douglas Cox.

The Henderson County Technical Review Committee reviewed the rezoning request at its April 3rd, 2018 meeting and found no technical restrictions on this request. The Henderson County Planning Board reviewed the rezoning request at its April 19th, 2018 meeting and voted to send forth a favorable recommendation to the BOC.

Motion:

I move that the Board schedules a public hearing for rezoning application #R-2018-02 for June 4, 2018, at 5:30 p.m.

2018-58 Budget Amendment – SAN

The IT Department respectfully requests Board approval to spend \$325,000 from the IT Depreciation Fund, established by the Board in the FY16 Budget. The current balance in the fund is \$499,700. The transfer would fund the replacement of the County's main storage area network (SAN). The existing equipment, purchased seven years ago, has reached the end of life for hardware support.

This request would replace that major system with a modern converged system that combines both servers and storage into a consolidated unit "block". Each block offers synchronous replication for high availability to a disaster recovery site, to allow zero downtime for planned maintenance and unplanned events. The quote attached contains 3 nodes on each block, times two – a primary site and a disaster recovery site.

Motion:

I move the Board of Commissioners approves the Budget Amendment to transfer \$325,000 from the IT Depreciation Fund, into the General Fund for this equipment purchase.

2018-59 Draft East Flat Rock Community Plan - Amendments

The East Flat Rock (EFR) Community Plan Advisory Committee, formed by the Board of Commissioners in 2015, was responsible for developing and recommending a community-specific comprehensive plan for the East Flat Rock Planning Area. The committee met monthly over an eighteen-month period, held two public input sessions, and conducted a mailed survey to all property owners in the planning area.

On March 16, 2017, the EFR Community Plan Advisory Committee presented the draft plan to the Planning Board. The Planning Board provided additional opportunities for public input including an online survey and two additional public input meetings held in the King Street Meeting Room and at Hillandale Elementary School. A mailed notice was also sent to owners of property with a recommended zoning change. On November 16, 2017 the Planning Board voted unanimously to send forth a favorable recommendation on the Draft EFR Community Plan.

The Board of Commissioners was presented the draft plan at its on February 21, 2018, and continued its discussion at the March 21, 2018 meeting. The BOC had questions about some of the recommendations and directed the Planning Board review and present revised recommendations as discussed by the Commissioners. The Planning Board reviewed the recommendations and voted to send forward a favorable recommendation on the plan as amended at its April 19, 2018 meeting. The draft amended recommendations were provided in the agenda packet.

Amendments to the East Flat Rock Community Plan Recommendations

The Planning Board recommend the following amendments to address concerns discussed by the Board of Commissioners. Changes are highlighted in red.

Goal N1. Protect land quality and access within the EFR Planning Area.

N1.3. Encourage increased access to the Green River Game Lands. The County should work with the North Carolina Department of Conservation to promote the area as a viable recreation

opportunity. The County should also work with Duke Energy to provide public access on the existing right of way leading to the Green River Game Lands. The County should work with the appropriate State agencies to promote the area for recreation and explore opportunities for additional access to the game lands.

Goal T1. Improve the transportation network in the East Flat Rock Planning Area.

- T1.2. Improve identified intersections based on recommended studies. The conditions of the following intersections pose automobile, bicycle, and pedestrian safety concerns and should be studied and improved:
 - 1. Blue Ridge Road and Spartanburg Highway
 - 2. Access management along Spartanburg Highway and Upward Road

Goal E2. Support industrial development within the East Flat Rock Planning Area.

E2.1. Work to provide affordable housing for the County workforce. Support workforce housing options in the County.

Goal LUD1. Residential Zoning District Map Amendments.

LUD1.1. Residential Two (R2): Replace Estate Residential (R-40) zoning with Residential Two Rural (R2R) zoning west of Greenville Highway within the "island" of East Flat Rock. In addition, replace a small section of Residential One (R1) on the western edge of the existing R40 district with R2. (See Map 7). Note: Keep existing LC zoning at intersection of Greenville Highway (US 25 S) and Erkwood Drive.

Motion:

I move the Board adopts the East Flat Rock Community Plan as amended. I further move that the goals and objectives be reviewed by County appointed committees and boards for their implementation if deemed appropriate.

Justus to serve another term and the position of Chair, and further nominated her. Chairman Edney made the motion to accept the reappointment of Carolyn Justus to position #4 and Chair by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

2018-60 BALFOUR PARKWAY DISCUSSION

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners is requested to discuss the NCDOT proposed Balfour Parkway, and direct staff regarding any steps to be taken.

Commissioner Thompson disclosed that he is a partner with Westside Village on Highway 191. He is also concerned about residential and farming areas. He feels that the Commissioners should possibly just kill the project.

Commissioner Messer agrees, if the project continues, many people's homes may be disturbed. Kill the project and ask citizens to provide valuable input to NCDOT. NCDOT needs to start all over with traffic studies.

Commissioner Hawkins understands that people are opposed to the Balfour Parkway and the Board needs to make that change.

Commissioner Lapsley provided background for the project and stated NCDOT would listen to the Board and stop the project if that is the desire. The State appropriates gasoline tax money for these projects and will quickly move on to another project. The representatives of the Transportation Advisory Committee have given this to the NCDOT as a priority. He does not feel the project needs to be stopped but pushed along faster with the direction to NCDOT not to use any of the subdivisions or neighborhoods in any way. Mr. Lapsley supports the Resolution but is in favor of the project in an expedited manner. The project could be killed in the future if necessary.

Chairman Edney stated there are traffic issues. Four Seasons Boulevard is a nightmare. He feels however the people making the decisions for the Balfour Parkway were not engineers and do not know the area.

Chairman Edney made the motion that the Board adopts a substitute resolution, opposing the "Balfour Parkway", and asking NCDOT to abandon it, and begin new planning to come up with reasonable and realistic alternatives to address local traffic concerns. The motion passed 4 - 1 with Commissioner Lapsley voting nay.

PRESENTATION OF THE FY18-19 COUNTY MANAGER'S RECOMMENDED BUDGET

The County Manager presented his FY 2018-2019 Recommended Budget during this meeting.

County Manager Steve Wyatt stated the budget is balanced in accordance with the North Carolina Budget and Fiscal Control Act and other relevant statutes. The budget continues the Board of Commissioners' emphasis on education funding while holding the cost of general government to a minimum level of growth.

This commitment is evident by major investments in school construction, safety and security. Debt service for the county school systems totals a record \$10,018,743 as Edneyville Elementary and Hendersonville High School debt payments become funding responsibilities alongside the Innovative High School, Mills River, Hillandale, Sugarloaf, Apply Valley/North Henderson, Dana and other previously constructed projects.

Not reflected in the school district budget is an increase of \$1,770,000 in the Sheriff's Department to assign a full-time school resource deputy at the remaining schools that do not have law enforcement officers currently assigned. Coupled with the \$10,018,743 school debt service obligations, an increase of \$2,741,482, these two items alone add an additional \$4,511,000 to the County budget over the current year.

Under North Carolina law, school facilities are the responsibility of County Government while the operational expenses of the school systems are largely the responsibility of the Governor and State legislature. To that end this proposal designates \$1,000,000 in local funding to conduct a system wide physical security assessment of each school and to begin the process of implementing the finds and recommendations of that assessment within the 2018-2019 fiscal year. An additional \$1,000,000 is allocated for general maintenance of school facilities.

Recognizing the need for the school staff and Board to fill in funding gaps when the Governor and State legislators fail to provide funding satisfactorily to local priorities an amount of \$26,613,000 is allocated for use by the School Board for discretionary funding. It is also notable that two new school nursing positions are being filled to comply with the Board of Commissioners desire to see one school nurse per seven hundred and fifty students. This comes at an additional \$141,850. The total for the school nursing program will be \$1,332,619 with a total of 18 nurses funded in the Budget of the Health Department.

To fund these investment in the local school system, County government funding is limited to a 1% operational increase over current year.

Mr. Wyatt requests the Board's Fund Balance restriction of twelve percent (12%) be lowered to ten percent (10%) in the 2018-2019 budget to negate the need for a tax increase in this the fourth and final year of the 2015 reevaluation cycle. Utilization of reserves accumulated over the past fiscal years allow the tax rate to remain unchanged. Without sufficient fund balance to appropriate the tax rate would climb to 67.5 cents per hundred, a 19.5% increase.

On the horizon, a reduction to the fund balance available may have an impact on the County Board rating which can affect the interest rate paid on future, including "Hendersonville High School" debt. As of now that debt service is estimated to increase an additional \$3.3 million dollars in fiscal year 2019-2020, bringing the two year increase to over \$6,000,000. Given these facts coupled with the investment in school safety and security, it is imperative that all County departments and funding entities begin the process now of planning for the next four year cycle.

If is quite remarkable that this organization can accomplish all of these things while maintaining one of the lowest tax rates in the State of North Carolina.


