Acceptance shall create a contract having an order of precedence as follows: In cases of conflict between documents comprising the contract, the order of precedence shall be (1) special terms and conditions specific to this ITB/RFQ, (2) specifications and requirements under the Instruction to Bidders, (3) Henderson County Terms and Conditions of this ITB/RFQ, and (5) the agreed portions of the awarded Vendor's offer. **No contract shall be binding on the County until an encumbrance of funds and preaudit has been made for payment of the sums due under the contract.**

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

Section 1: Purpose

The purpose of this document is to provide general and specific information for a turnkey equipment storage facility at the Tommy H. Thompson Emergency Services Center, 2529 Asheville Highway Hendersonville, NC 28792. All bids and contracts are governed by Henderson County policy and Section 143-131 of the North Carolina General Statutes.

Section 2: Bid Schedule

Listed below are the dates and times by which stated actions must be taken or completed. The County may determine, in its sole discretion, that it is necessary to change any of these dates and times. Should changes be required, proper notice will be provided to potential bidders. All listed times are Eastern standard times.

Section 3: Mandatory Pre-bid

A **MANDATORY PRE-BID MEETING** will be held at the front entrance of the Tommy H. Thompson Emergency Services Center 2529 Asheville Highway, Hendersonville NC, 28792 on November 8th, 2023, at 10 am. If your company does not attend the pre-bid meeting or is not present for the duration of the meeting your bid will not be considered as responsive.

Section 5: Bidder Questions

The County is not liable for interpretations/misinterpretations or other errors, or omissions made by the Bidder in responding to this bid. The Bidder shall examine this bid to determine if the County's requirements and terms and conditions are clearly stated. If, after examination of the various requirements and terms and conditions of this bid, the Bidder believes there are any requirements or terms and conditions which remain unclear or which restrict competition, the Bidder may request, in writing, that the County clarify the requirement(s) and terms(s) and condition(s) specified by the Bidder. The Bidder must provide the Section(s), Subsection(s), Paragraph(s), and page number(s) that identify the requirements or conditions questioned by the Bidder.

Requests for clarification, technical questions, and approval of alternate products to this bid must be received by the County no later than the date shown above in Section 2, entitled "Bid Schedule", under

Deadline for Questions. The Bidders' failure to request clarification and submit questions by the date in the bid schedule above shall be considered to constitute the Bidders' acceptance of all County requirements and terms and conditions. The County shall issue addenda reflecting questions and answers to this bid, if any, and shall be posted to the County's website at <https://www.hendersoncountync.gov/rfps>.

Section 6: Objections to the Specifications

It is not the intent of the bid specifications to exclude or limit competition or favor any supplier. If there is an objection to any of the specifications or requirements listed herein, the bidder must notify Doug Guffey, Purchasing Agent in writing, stating and listing the specifications and objections, no later than the date shown above in Section 2, entitled "Bid Schedule", under Deadline for Questions. If a pre-bid meeting has been scheduled, any objections must be presented in writing at that time. The objections stated must pertain both to form and substance of the bid document. Failure to object in accordance with the above procedure shall constitute a waiver on the part of the bidder to protest the solicitation. All concerns, questions, clarifications, or other correspondence must be directed only to Doug Guffey, Purchasing Agent. Information obtained from other sources will not be considered in the evaluation and award of this bid.

Section 7: Alternate Bids

Alternate bids are allowed. Alternate bids are those that are not identical by manufacturer and model to what is outlined within the bid document or one which has substantially different specifications to what is outlined in the bid document. When alternate bids are submitted, the bidder must submit documentation for review as a part of the bid to show that the product meets or exceeds the specifications of the item(s) referenced in the specifications. It shall be the responsibility of the bidder to show that the alternate equipment is equivalent and conforms to the specifications contained herein. Bidders may submit multiple bids on various manufacturers' brands/models.

Section 8: Bid Options

The County reserves the right to request pricing on optional equipment or services along with the pricing for the main or primary product or items when applicable. At the discretion of the County, some or all of the options requested may or may not be added and purchased based upon necessity and the availability of budgeted funds. The bid award will be made to the lowest, responsive, responsible bidder for the main or primary product or services on the Bid Proposal Form. Pricing for any additional options will be requested in a separate section of the bid and will not be included in the determination of the bid award.

Section 9: How to Prepare Bid Proposals

Bidders are encouraged to carefully review all provisions and attachments of this document prior to completion. Each bid constitutes an offer and may not be withdrawn except as provided herein. Also, prices are to remain firm for the period stated herein.

- I. **PROPOSAL FORM:** Submit all prices and offers on the **BID PROPOSAL FORM(s)** provided herein. All bid proposals must be submitted and signed by the supplier or their authorized representative with all erasures or corrections initialed and dated by the authorized representative of the proposal.
- II. **Addendum(s):** If applicable, bidders shall include signed addendum(s) with their bid submittal acknowledging the modifications made to the bid document.

- III. **SIGNATURE:** All bids must be signed by an authorized official of the company on the Bidders Signature Page.

- IV. Please note bids not received by the time and date specified on the Bid Proposal Form will not be opened or considered.
- V. Bidders shall provide any available product literature and manufacturer's specifications at the request of Henderson County.

Section 11: Bid Opening

- I. All bids will be opened at the time and place shown on the enclosed Bid Proposal Form. **LATE BIDS WILL NOT BE OPENED OR ACCEPTED.**
- II. Bids will be examined by the Purchasing Agent and the using department officials promptly after the opening and an award made as early as possible.
- III. Bidders may request and receive copies of the bid document and/or bid tabulation after the award of the project.

Section 12: Award of Bid

- I. **Standard of Bid Award Acceptance:**
The County reserves the right to reject any and/or all bids received as allowed by law, or to select the bid which, in our opinion, is in the best overall interest of the County. The award shall be made to the lowest, responsive, responsible bidder, or bidders, taking into consideration quality, performance and the time specified in the bid for the performance of the contract.
- II. **Bid Prices:**
All items and products proposed in response to this Bid are to be new, in un-used condition unless otherwise noted in the Minimum Specifications. All prices proposed in response to this Bid are to include all transport, freight, fuel surcharges and other fees if applicable and be delivered **FOB destination, freight prepaid and allowed** to the location provided on the County Purchase Order if not otherwise instructed within the specifications section. All items are to be packaged, and shipped or delivered safely in a protective carton, fully assembled and serviced, ready for use and operation where applicable or otherwise described within the specifications.

All supplies, equipment, and apparatus must meet all Federal, State, and Local safety regulations, requirements, and guidelines, such as OSHA, EPA, US DOT, NC-DOT, NFPA, UL, etc., if so regulated.

Section 13: Errors in Bids

Bidders or their authorized representatives are expected to understand the conditions, requirements, and specifications before submitting bids. Failure to do so will be at the bidders' own risk. In case of an error in the extension of prices on the bid, the unit price shall govern.

Section 14: Bid Tabulation

Bidders may request a bid tabulation from the Purchasing Agent, after the bid has been awarded (NCGS 143-131(a)).

Section 15: Specifications

I. Overview:

It is the intent of these specifications to set up minimum requirements for the turnkey construction of a new equipment building as specified. These specifications must be considered as minimum requirements. If it is necessary to bid alternate equipment or to take exceptions to the specifications as set forth, this must be so stated in your bid. Any reference to a model or brand is only to denote quality and does not mean that equal equipment will not be considered.

II. Specifications

- A.** Grade existing gravel lot level, and form to accept a 60' x 80' finished concrete slab, saving gravel to backfill under shed roof sections.
- B.** Install 4" of # 57 stone for slab, provide termite protection, and vapor barrier.
- C.** Install a 40'x 60'x 6" 4000 psi with commercial filler concrete slab with a 2' x 18" thick perimeter footing consisting of 2 rows of #4 rebar.
- D.** Install 13 – 2'x2'x12" deep concrete pier holes per diagram provided at Pre- bid meeting.
- E.** The building shall be a pre-engineered building.
- F.** Cut and remove approximately 60" of existing concrete curbing to allow for apron access to building.
- G.** Install 12' x 60' x 6" thick, 4000 psi with commercial filler concrete apron on front of building tying into existing asphalt.
- H.** Supply and Erect 40' x 60' x 14', minimum 29-gauge metal building with 3/12 roof pitch and treated 6" x 6" posts set on steel brackets anchored to concrete, posts shall be set on a minimum of 10' centers, engineered roof trusses to be set on 5' centers minimum with approved hurricane strapping.
- I.** Approved building construction shall consist of a 20'x 40' gable end, open, overhang shed on right hand end of building, and a 20' x 60' shed roof on rear of building with 2/12 roof pitch. (Renderings and post locations will be available at Pre-bid meeting)
- J.** Building shall have 4- 12' x 12' non insulated, overhead doors with Lift master commercial openers.
- K.** Building shall have two- 3'0 x 7'0 walk through metal doors on each end of building.
- L.** Electrical requirements will be handed out during Pre-bid meeting.

- M.** Install approximately 425 ft of 6', 9-gauge galvanized mesh chain link fencing with tension wire around perimeter of gravel area topped with 3 strands of barbed wire. All posts to be set in concrete.
- N.** Fence posts shall be a minimum of 4" OD gate posts, 3" OD corner posts, and 2 ½" line posts with 1 5/8" OD top rail. Corner and gate posts shall be trussed and braced.
- O.** Install 1- 16-foot cantilevered drive through gate and 1- 4-foot walk through gate at locations specified during pre-bid meeting.
- P.** Grade and dispose of dirt offsite for approximately 4000 sq ft of future parking area at adjacent 2523 Asheville highway. After grade is established, install 4" of ABC stone and compact. Seed and straw disturbed areas that are not graveled.
- Q.** Install 6" (trim color matched) guttering on front and rear of building with a minimum of 6 – 3" x 4" downspouts with turnout elbows and concrete splash blocks at the base.

III. Installation

- 1. Bidder shall provide a turnkey project inclusive of all labor, materials, supervision, disposal fees, permits, inspections, taxes as applicable.
- 2. Install all materials and equipment in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and warranty requirements.
- 3. Contractor must submit a timeline for the beginning and completion of the project at the request of Henderson County.
- 4. Contractor is to obtain and pay for all required permits and inspections. Any deficiencies found in the installation or materials used in the installation which prevents receiving a green tag from inspectors or issues found during the final walkthrough with County representatives will be the Contractors responsibility and expense to correct.
- 5. Cleanup of all affected work areas shall be completed daily.

IV. Warranty

- 1. The installation services and materials furnished by the contractor, or any subcontractors shall be free from any defects in workmanship for a period of one year from the date of final payment.

V. Acceptance of Work

- 1. Bidder shall perform a final walk through with a County representative upon completion.
- 2. Henderson County shall receive all inspections, certifications, and permits required by local and State agencies as applicable. Henderson County is to receive written copies of all.
- 3. Henderson County shall receive all warranties, maintenance manuals, product data, and closeout documents as applicable.

Section 16: Licensure

Bidder shall provide a copy of their general contractor licensure. If not provided the bid will be considered nonresponsive.

Section 17: Minority and Disadvantaged Business

Pursuant to General Statutes of North Carolina Sections 143-128 and 143-131 and, the County encourages and provides equal opportunity for Certified Minority and Women- Owned Business Enterprise (MWBEO) businesses to participate in all aspects of the County's contracting and procurement programs.

Due to the state funding source of this project the HUB participation goal will be 10%.

Section 18: Terms and Conditions

These Terms and Conditions, which refer to a “purchase order”, shall be deemed to be included in any contract entered into as a result of this Invitation to Bid (“ITB”).

Any attempt by a proposed contracting party (the “Bidder”) under the ITB to exclude any of these Terms and Conditions shall cause any bid or proposal made in response to this ITB to be deemed to be non-responsive (unless Henderson County has notified the Bidder that the funding source for the goods or work sought under this ITB is not federal funds, in which case those provisions under number 15 of the Terms and Conditions (and all subparts thereunder) may be excluded from a Proposal.

Section 19: Minimum Insurance Requirements

Bidder shall provide an Insurance Certificate naming Henderson County as **additionally insured** per the attached certificate of insurance. Should different insurance limits be established between the vendor and the County, the Certificate of Insurance with Henderson County named as additional insured shall be contained herein.
